

RESOLUTION NO. 2007-

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LAKEWOOD REVISING THE PERMIT SYSTEM FOR THE PARKING OF RECREATIONAL VEHICLES, TRAILERS AND SEMI-TRAILERS.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LAKEWOOD DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption and shall supersede City Council Resolution No. 2006-67, adopted on September 12, 2006; however, the changes to the existing permit system set forth in Section 2, below, shall not be implemented until October 1, 2007, due to the need to complete reprogramming of the online system.

SECTION 2. The criteria for the issuance of permits for the legal on-street parking of those vehicles, the parking of which is otherwise prohibited by subsection L or subsection R of Section 3251 of the Lakewood Municipal Code, shall be as follows:

1. Only a Lakewood resident may obtain a permit, and only for a vehicle registered to a Lakewood address other than a post office box.
2. Each permit shall be issued for a period of one (1) to three (3) days.
3. The maximum number of such permitted days for any vehicle shall be 52 in any calendar year.
4. The maximum number of permitted days for vehicles registered at any one address shall be 104 in any calendar year, regardless of the number of vehicles registered at such address.
5. The maximum number of permits issued at any one address, for any one day, shall be two.
6. For any vehicle, there must be a minimum of one (1) unpermitted day between the last day of any permit, and the first day of any subsequent permit.

SECTION 3. Lakewood residents may apply for permits to allow on-street parking for greater periods of time than those specified in Section 2, for a maximum period of six months, based on extraordinary hardships comprised of either a medical necessity of a life-threatening nature, or a circumstance in which such vehicle provides the sole source of transportation for such resident. The Director of Administrative services shall be empowered to issue such permits, and to impose conditions thereon. An applicant may seek reconsideration by the Director of Administrative Services by providing relevant new information. Following such reconsideration, an applicant may

appeal to the License and Permit Hearing Board, upon payment of a \$50.00 fee, which Board shall render a final decision.

SECTION 4. Lakewood residents may apply for permits to allow parking of recreational vehicles, trailers or semi-trailers, on residential properties, in locations or in such a manner in which parking of such vehicles is otherwise prohibited by the Lakewood Municipal Code. Such applications shall be subject to the same criteria and procedures set forth in Section 3, above.
