Lakewood Teen Action Committee

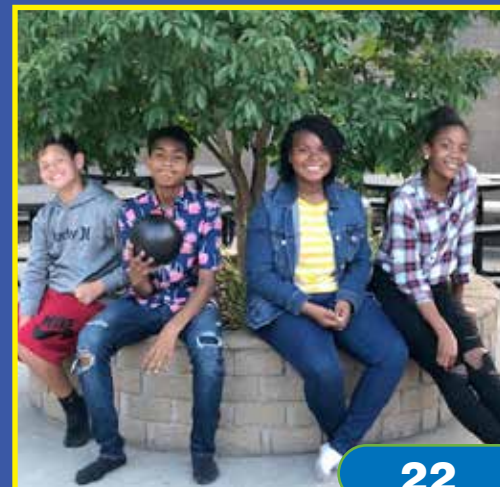

TEEN RESOURCE CENTER
