INTRODUCTION

The City of Lakewood is a member of the California Joint Powers Insurance Authority (CJPIA), and participates in its pooled self-insured liability claims and losses with other CJPIA members under a Memorandum of Coverage.

STATEMENT OF FACT

As a member of the CJPIA, and pursuant to Government Code Section 910 et seq., agencies have the option of authorizing the CJPIA to perform the administrative claims handling process. The administrative process includes the responsibility to act on the City's behalf to accept, reject, return as insufficient, or return as untimely any claims, and to provide notices as authorized under the statute on behalf of the City.

This option has been reviewed by City staff, with the CJPIA, and determined that delegating claims processing responsibility to the CJPIA would be a beneficial arrangement.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

It is respectfully recommended that the City Council adopt the Resolution delegating tort liability claims handling responsibility to the California Joint Powers Insurance Authority.

Video Production Services and AV Fee Schedule

INTRODUCTION

The fee schedule for Centre AV equipment and the Media Production Center video production equipment is presented annually for approval by the City Council.

The changes submitted reflect the addition of new video production equipment and AV equipment and minor changes in the rental of certain items based on fair market rents. The attached fee schedules reflect the modifications made during FY 2013-2014 and are recommended for approval at this time.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Section 5(B) of the City concession agreement with Thank Goodness It's Sofia provides, in part:

... City shall have the exclusive right to provide any telecommunications, audio-visual, visual display, lighting and P.A. equipment and services... Any charge the City shall impose for said service, other than the Audiovisual Processing Fee as described in Section 12(F), shall belong to the City and the Concessionaire shall not charge or receive any consideration for the same....

Annually, revenues generated to the City include approximately \$35,000 in Centre at Sycamore Plaza audio-visual services fees and \$2,100 in media production center equipment and video production fees. The revenues from the audio-visual fees are used to partially offset the cost of equipment replacement.

The attached Media Production Rental and Services Fee and Centre AV rental and service schedule represents both existing and modified fees. Additions or changes in the media production center fee schedule are in bold face and items to be deleted are crossed out. Additions or changes to the Centre AV Equipment and Services form are listed on the second page of that form. The Centre AV rental fee schedule includes a 50% reduction DVD projector packages fee discount for bona fide Lakewood nonprofit organizations and a \$250 discount on AV for events with a food cost exceeding \$5000.

The City Council annually reviews and approves these fee schedules. Throughout the year, minor changes are made reflecting current market activity.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

That the City Council approve the revised fee schedules for the Media Production Center and Centre AV rental and authorize the Assistant City Manager to adjust the fee schedule as needed to reflect changes in the marketplace.

INTRODUCTION

Pursuant to Section 9220, et seq., of the Lakewood Municipal Code, the applicant, William Lyon Homes, Inc., has filed the Final Map of Tract No. 72071 for City Council approval. The acceptance of the Final Map is in compliance with Title 7, Division 2, Chapter 2, Article 2, Final Maps, of the State of California Government Code.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Tract No. 72071 is a 72-unit residential condominium subdivision generally located at 3014 South Street. The Final Map before the City Council represents the completion of the City's review and approval process. This process included approval of a Zone Change from M-F-R to PD-MF and approval of the Vesting Tentative Tract Map on June 25, 2014 (City Council Resolution No. 2013-27).

The conditions of approval set forth in City Council Resolution No. 2013-27 and Planning and Environment Commission Resolution No. 11-2013 have been met by the subdivider. Improvements required and not yet installed include street improvements (such as the replacement of any damaged curb gutter and sidewalk) and installation of sewer lines and other infrastructure. Subdivision Improvement Agreements and proper security have been posted with the City by the applicant, guaranteeing the completion of the required improvements.

Monuments have been set at the property corners to the satisfaction of the Los Angeles County Department of Public Works. The applicant shall pay the Parks and Recreation fee of \$394,722.22 prior to occupancy of the project, pursuant to Section 53077.5 of the Government Code and a Homeowners Association will be provided through the Declaration of Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions (CC&R's). The City restrictions contained therein are in conformity with City Council Resolution No. 2013-27 and with Section 9332.2 of the Lakewood Municipal Code.

The Final Map has been reviewed by the City Engineer, County of Los Angeles Department of Public Works, and has been determined by said office as ready for City Council approval and acceptance (see attached letter dated July 31, 2014).

SUMMARY

The requirements of Tract No. 72071 have been satisfied and the map is before the City Council for acceptance.





The written proposal of City Ventures, Inc., 1900 Quail Street, Newport Beach, California 92660, owner of an interest in the following described real property, requests approval to subdivide that real property within the City of Lakewood described as: Lot 2 of Certificate Of Compliance for Lot Line Adjustment No. 2011-2 recorded December 20, 2011, as Instrument No. 1722125 of Official Records being that portion of Parcel 2 of Parcel Map No. 26346 in the City Of Lakewood, County of Los Angeles, State of California, as Per Map Recorded in Book 313, Pages 13 through 15, inclusive, of Parcel Maps, in the County Recorder's Office of Said County, also known as Los Angeles County Assessor's Parcel Number 7157-007-009 and Vesting Tentative Traet Map No. 72071. The proposal was received by the Planning and Environment Commission (PEC) and considered at its meeting on the 6th day of June, 2013, as shown in the attached minutes and report, attached hereto and made a part hereof as though set forth in full. The Planning and Environment Commission does hereby recommend for approval as set forth hereinafter.

This resolution, along with the findings and recommendations herein contained, with records of the proceedings before the PEC as well as all files and exhibits in this matter, shall constitute the report of the PEC to the City Council.

SECTION 2. The Planning and Environment Commission does hereby find that an Initial Study has been prepared for the proposed project, Zone Change No. 112, and Vesting Tentative Tract Map No. 72071 pursuant to Section 15063 of the California Environmental Quality Act Guidelines, as amended. A Mitigated Negative Declaration has been prepared for the project, pursuant to Section 15070, et. seq., of the Guidelines. Based on the Environmental Checklist and the Initial Study and the mitigation measures contained therein, this project is found to have no significant effect on the environment, following implementation of the mitigation measures contained therein

SECTION 3. The Planning and Environment Commission (PEC) does hereby report that a public hearing was held before the PEC in respect to said application on the 6th day of June, 2013 and notification of said hearing was made as required by law. A summary of the hearing is contained in the minutes of the PEC.

- SECTION 4. The Planning and Environment Commission of the City of Lakewood, hereby finds and determines:
- A. Notice of the time and place of the public hearing in connection with this matter has been given in the manner required by State law and Section 9422 of the Lakewood Municipal Code.
- B. The proposed map and design and improvements of the proposed subdivision are consistent with the General Plan.
- C. The site is physically suitable for the type of development and the proposed density of the development.
- D. The design of the subdivision or the proposed improvements is not likely to cause substantial environmental damage, or substantially and avoidably injure flsh or wildlife and their habitat.
- E. The design of the subdivision and the type of improvement is not likely to cause serious physical health problems.
- F. The design of the subdivision or the type of improvement will not conflict with easements acquired by the public at large for access through, or use of the property within the proposed subdivision.
- G. Approval is requested for Vesting Tentative Tract Map No. 72071, a 72-unit Multiple Femily Dwelling Unit Planned Development project at 2922 South Street.
- H. The Division of Land Committee met to review the subject tentative tract and inade findings and recommendations to the PEC by written report, pursuant to Section 9213.C of the Lakewood Municipal Code.
- I. The proposed project complies with Sections 9470, et seq., of the Lakewood Municipal Code, which governs such projects in the PD-MF (Multiple-Family Dwelling Unit Planned Development) zone, which is the proposed zoning of the subject site.
- J. The discharge of sewage from this land division into the public sewer system will not violate the requirements of the California Regional Water Quality Control Board pursuant to Division 7 (commencing with Section 1300) of the Water Code.
- SECTION 5. The Planning and Environment Commission hereby further finds and recommends that said subdivision and map marked as Exhibit "H," should be approved as to area improvements and lot design, flood water drainage controls, and the requirements of the Subdivision Ordinance, subject to the conditions hereinafter set forth:

- A. Approval of Vesting Tentative Tract Map No. 72071 is based on Exhibit "H."
- B. Provisions shall be made for the continual maintenance of the common areas. This shall be achieved by the formation of a homeowner's association, comprised of the owners of the residential units responsible for the maintenance of the common areas.
- C. Covenants, Conditions, and Restrictions (CC&R's) shall be prepared and approved by the Director of Community Development and the City Attorney. In reviewing and approving the CC&R's, adequate provisions shall be made and included in the CC&R's, for the following:
 - 1. Compliance with the terms and provisions of the Precise Plan.
- 2. Responsible management and the perpetual succession of management for the homeowner's association.
- 3. Name and address of the person who will serve as the responsible manager and the appointment of a successor to the manager.
 - 4. Recording the neme and address of any successors to the management.
 - 5. Fix and determine management responsibility for all service and utility connections.
- 6. Establish the responsibility for the homeowners' association to maintain all common areas and facilities, including walls, driveways, sidewalks, landscaped areas, trash enclosure, lighting, hardscape, common area structures, and for the collection of the cost of repair or on-going maintenance thereof.
- 7. Establish the responsibility for compliance with all of the terms and provisions of the Devclopment Review Board approval, any Precise Plan approval, and compliance with the zoning, building and other ordinances of the City, including said permit.
- 8. Establish the responsibility for management to be a person or persons upon whom service of any notice, summons, city or court order may be made, and that such service will be binding on all owners of the property in respect to the occupancy, use, or compliance with the terms and provisions of subdivision approval, Precise Plan, approval of the Development Review Board, and compliance with the ordinances of the City, including said permit.
- 9. Require that use of the project site for condominium, planned development, community apartment, stock cooperative project, or investment apartment purposes shall continue only during the existence and compliance with the terms and conditions of this subdivision approval, Development Review Board approval, and the Development Plan and Precise Plan.
- 10. Require the maintenance of the exterior and interior of each dwelling unit by the respective property owner of each dwelling unit, unless that responsibility or portions of that

responsibility are specifically assigned to the homeowners' association in writing.

- 11. Require each garage to be equipped with an automatic garage door opener and that such automatic door openers shall be maintained in operating condition at all times.
- 12. Require that all garages remain unobstructed so as to allow two vehicles to park in each garage and require that all exterior parking spaces remain unobstructed to allow one vehicle to park in each designated parking space.
- 13. Require that no boats, recreational vehicles, trailers or other such vehicles shall be stored in any garage, exterior parking space, or any other location on this tract, and that no non-emergency auto repairs shall be allowed in any parking space.
- 14. Prohibit the outdoor storage of personal items, except for outdoor patio furniture, landscaping pots and portable barbeques.
- 15. Require that there shall be uo amendment to the CC&R's without the approval of the Planning and Environment Commission.
- 16. The CC&R's shall coutain a provisiou that the aforementioned enumerated conditions 1 through 15 shall run in favor of the City of Lakewood, a Municipal Corporation, as well as all other persons interested in said subdivision, and in the event of violation may be enforced by the City of Lakewood, but the failure to do so shall not bar their enforcement in any future proceedings brought by the City of Lakewood or any other interested party.
- D. The following accessory structures and uses are permitted within the rear yards of this subdivision: Arbors, Gazebos, Barbeques, Swimming Pools, Spas, and Playground Equipment. The rear yard for this subdivision is defined as a yard extending across the full width of the lot between the side lot lines and measured between the rear lot line and the nearest rear line of the main building. Said accessory structures and uses shall be not less than five fect (5') from any site property line. Such accessory structures and uses shall be subject to review and approval by the Homeowners Association of this subdivision and the Development Review Board prior to the issuance of any planning approvals or permits. An amendment to the development plan/precise plan shall not be necessary for said accessory structures and uses.
- E. The project shall comply with the requirements of the Hydrology Study which was conceptually approved on May 21, 2013 to the satisfaction of the Los Angeles County Department of Public Works. Approval of the map pertaining to drainage is recommended.
- F. The final map shall be approved by the County of Los Angeles Geotechnical and Materials Engineering Division (GMED) to assure that all geotechnical requirements have been properly depicted. For Final Map clearance guidelines refer to GS051.0 in the Manual for Preparation of Geotechnical Reports (fttp://www.dpw.lacountv.gov/gmcd/manual.pdf).

- G. A grading plan and soil and geology raport shall be geotechnically approved by GMED prior to Final Map approval. The grading depicted on the plan shall agree with grading depicted on the tentative tract or parcel map and the conditions approved by the Planning and Environment Commission. If the subdivision is to be recorded prior to the completion and acceptance of grading, corrective geologic bonds may be required.
- H. Prior to grading plan approval, a detailed engineering geology and soils engineering report shall be submitted which addresses the proposed grading. All recommendations of the gcotechnical consultants shall be incorporated into the plan (Refer to the Manual for Preparation of Geotechnical Reports at (fttp://www.dpw.lacountv.gov/gined/manual.pdf).
- 1. The following note shall be placed on the Final Map: "Geotechnical Note, Potential Building Site: For grading and corrective work requirements for access and building areas for Lot(s) No(s). All refer to reports by Alta California Geotechnical, Inc. dated Mareb 14, 2012 and December 5, 2012.
- J. At the gindrag plan stage, submit two sets of grading plans to the Soils section for verification of compliance with County codes and policies.
- K. Provide approval of the latest drainage report by the Los Angeles County Department of Public Works' Land Development Division, Storm Drain and Hydrology Section.
 - L. Provide approval of the grading plan by the Geotecknical and Materials Division.
- M. Provide approval of permits and/or letters of non-jurisdiction from all State and Fcderal agencies, as applicable. These agencies may include, but are not be limited to, the State of California Regional Water Quality Control Board, Sate of California Department of Fish and Game, State of California Department of Energy Conservation, Division of Oil, Gas, and Geothermal Resources; and the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers.
- N. Submit a grading plan for approval. The grading plan shall show and call out the following items, including but not limited to; construction of all drainage devices and details, paved driveways, elevation and drainage of all pads, SUSMP and LID devices (if applicable); and any required landscaping and irrigation not within common area or maintenance easement. Acknowledgement and/or approval from all easement bolders may be required.
- O. A maintenance agreement or Covenant, Conditions, and Restrictions may be required for all privately maintained drainage devices, slopes, and other facilities.
- P. Dedieate additional right of way for a 10-foot by 10-foot corner cut-off at the corner of South Street and the alley west of the property, along the property frontage, to the satisfaction of the City of Lakewood.

- Q. Reconstruct the existing curb ramp at the comer of South Street and the alley west of the property, along the property frontage, to the satisfaction of the City of Lakewood.
- R. Construct new driveways to meet eurrent Americans with Disabilities Act guidelines along the property frontage on South Strect to the satisfaction of the City of Lakewood.
- S. Repair any displaced, broken, or damaged pavement that occurred during construction along the property frontage on South Street and the alley west of the property to the satisfaction of the City of Lakewood.
- T. Prior to final map approval, enter in an agreement with the City's franchised cable TV operator (if an area is served) to permit the installation of cable in a common utility trench to the satisfaction of the City of Lakewood or provide documentation that steps to provide eable TV to the proposed subdivision have been initiated to the satisfaction of the City of Lakewood.
- U. Comply with recommended mitigation measures contained in the traffic impact analysis, if any, as a means of mitigating any traffic impacts as identified in the traffic impact analysis approved as approved by the City of Lakewood.
- V. Install and dedicate main line sewers on-site and off-site per PC 13-1 Lakewood and serve each building with a separate house lateral to the satisfaction of the City of Lakewood. Unless otherwise required by the City, construction of additional off-site sewer mainline per PC 02-1 Lakewood will be required should this sewer system not exist, posting of bonds will also be necessary prior to recordation should the improvements not be completed before then.
- W. Obtain a will serve letter from the Los Angelcs County Sanitation District for the discharge of sewer into the trunk system.
- X. Easements are required, subject to review by the City to determine the final locations and requirements.
- Y. Provide a minimum 10-foot sewer easement on the private driveway and fire lane to the satisfaction of the City.
- Z. An on-site water system maintained by the developer or Home Owners' Association, with appurtenant facilities to serve all buildings on the land division, must be provided. The system shall include fire hydrants of the type and location as determined by the Fire Department. The water mains shall be sized to accommodate the total domestic and fire flows.
- AA. There shall be filed with the City Engineer a statement from the water purveyor indicating that the water system will be operated in a manner approved be the purveyor, and that under normal conditions, the system will meet the requirements for the land division and that water service will be provided to each building, to the satisfaction of the City of Lakewood.

- BB. Place a note on the final map, to the satisfaction of the City Engineer, indicating that this map is approved as a condominium project for 72 units.
- CC. Label driveways and multiple access strips as private driveway and fire lane and delineate on the final map to the satisfaction of the City Engineer.
- DD. If required, provide a suitable turnareund and label the driveway "Private Driveway and Fire Lane" on the final map to the satisfaction of the Fire Department.
- EE. Provide reciprocal easement for drainage, ingress/egress, sewer, water, utilities, maintenance purposes, and etc., over the common driveway in a document to the satisfaction of the City Engineer.
- FF. Provisions shall be made for the continual maintenance of the common areas and utility lines. This can be achieved by the formation of a homeowner's association comprised of the owners of the residential units responsible for the maintenance of the common areas.
- GG. Relocate or quitclaim any easements interfering with building locations to the satisfaction of the City Engineer.
- HH. Developer shall provide addressing information in Microsoft Excel format to the satisfaction of the City Engineer.
- II. Private easements shall not be granted or recorded within areas proposed to be granted, dedicated, or offered for dedication until after the final map is filed with the Los Angeles County Registrar-Recorder/County Clerk's office. If easements are granted after the date of tentative approval, a subordination shall be executed by the easement holder prior to the filing of the final map.
- JJ. A final guarantee shall be required at the time the final map is filed with the Los Angeles County Registrar-Recorder/County Clerk's office.
- KK. A final map prepared by or under the direction of a pre-1982 registered Civil Engineer or licensed Land Surveyor, shall be processed through the City Engineer prior to being filed with the Los Angeles County Registrar-Recorder/County Clerk's office.
- LL. Construct and/or replace all cracked and damaged curbs, gutters, driveways, sidewalks, and pavement according to Los Angeles County standards and their encroachment permit.
- MM. New driveways shall be installed according to Los Angeles County standards and permit.
- NN. Developer shall install/replace disabled person ramp according to Los Angeles County standards and permit.

- OO. Developer shall provide a plan showing sufficient detail to demonstrate how trash and recycling containers will be placed for collection including space for bulky item collection that will be satisfactory for collection operations by EDCO Disposal. The disposal plan shall be approved by EDCO.
- PP. Private roadways used for on-site refuse collection shall accommodate vehicle weights of 55,000 pounds or more.
- QQ. Roof and lot drainage shall flow under sidewalks. Curb drains shall be at least one foot from property line and on each side of the driveway epproach. Curb drains shall be according to Los Angeles County standards and permit.
- RR. Existing street lighting on South Street in public right-of-way is sufficient. Developer shall install street lighting for the parking on the west side of the development adjacent to the alley, as well as security cameras.
- SS. Developer shall comply with all NPDES requirements, adopted by the Regional Board on November 8, 2012, and effective December 28, 2012, including low-impact development requirements, and provide letter committing to maintenance of all drainage facilities and inclusion in future maintenance program permit system to be developed and implemented by the City of Lakewood in conformance with the aforementioned permit.
- TT. Provide to City of Lakewood, Public Works Department, all access codes to the complex.
 - UU. Street trees are not required in the parkway on South Street.
- VV. For trash and recycling purposes, the project is defined as a commercial collection account and will be served by and billed directly by the City's exclusive solid waste contractor.
- WW. All requests for service or complaints from project residents shall be made to the homeowner's association and transmitted to City's exclusive solid waste contractor. Any calls received by either City's exclusive solid waste contractor or by the City of Lakewood from any resident regarding individual service requests will be referred to the homeowner's association.
- XX. At the request of the developer, collection will be conducted via individual automated carts. Each dwelling unit shall provide space for one 65 gallon trash cart and one 65 gallon recycling cart within the garage. No additional carts, cans, bags, boxes or bundles shall be permitted.
- YY. The developer shall install patterned concrete delineating 144 numbered spaces for placement of the carts for collection. The spaces and the carts will be numbered with the corresponding unit numbers. The developer will furnish to City of Lakewood for approval a site plan showing the concrete pattern, two foot spaces between the cart pads, and the proposed method for unit number identification. The site plan shall show the location and dimensions of a covered trash

enclosure with a capacity for two three-cubic-yard bins. The trash enclosure shall be constructed and maintained in accordance with plans approved by the City of Lakewood.

- ZZ. Carts shall be set out for collection prior to 6:00 a.m. Any carts not placed within the appropriately identified collection space will not be collected by City's exclusive solid waste contractor, and no trash skip pickups will be made.
- AAA. The developer shall install one trash enclosure with sufficient space to accommodate one three-cubic-yard trash bin and one three-cubic-yard recycling bin. The homeowner's association shall contract with City's exclusive solid waste contractor for a minimum of weekly pickup for each three-cubic-yard, and shall contract for more frequent weekly service as necessary. The homeowner's association shall be financially responsible for any scout service required to move or empty the three-cubic-yard bins.
- BBB. The City's exclusive solid waste contractor will bill the homeowner's association one unified bill for all monthly service under the commercial rate chart approved annually by the City of Lakewood. The cart collection service will be billed under the commercial rate chart for once per week collection of commercial automated carts. No credit will be allowed for vaeant dwelling units except during the initial sales period. During the initial sales period, the monthly billing cart collection service will be based upon the monthly rate multiplied by the number of dwelling units sold, until all dwelling units have been sold. Once all dwelling units have been sold, no reduction in the monthly bill will be made for any dwelling units or units that are vaeant or which are in escrow.
- CCC. As a commercial account, project residents are not entitled to individual bulky item collection. Bulky item collection may be contracted for by the homeowner's association on a periodic basis by ordering a 40-cubic-yard roll-off bin from City's exclusive solid waste contractor, which will be billed at the regular commercial rates.
- DDD. Greenwaste generated by any landscape work shall be removed from the site and recycled by the homeowner's association's landscape contractor. The homeowner's association shall maintain records of greenwaste recycling and furnish them to the City of Lakewood upon request.
- EEE. Annual Christmas tree collection and recycling shall be done by the homeowner's association's landscape contractor, or the homeowner's association may contract with City's exclusive solid waste contractor for the appropriate commercial containers for Christmas tree recycling. The homeowner's association's shall maintain annual records of Christmas tree collection and furnish them to the City of Lakewood upon request.
- FFF. The developer or the homeowner's association shall pay for the initial acquisition of the specified new carts and for the dwelling unit labeling of those carts prior to delivery to the project site. The City's exclusive solid waste contractor will deliver the earts as each dwelling unit is sold. It shall be the responsibility of the developer or the homeowner's association to notify the City's exclusive solid waste contractor that a unit has been sold for the purpose of delivering the carts. The replacement cost for any missing or damaged or stolen earts shall be the responsibility of the homeowner's association.

- GGG. Any items dumped or left in the open parking spaces or within the trash enclosure area shall be the responsibility of the homeowner's association.
- HHH. Access shall comply with Section 503 of the Fire Code, which requires all weather access. All weather access may require paving.
- III. Private driveways shall be indicated on the final map as "Private Driveway and Fire Lane" with the widths clearly depicted and shall be maintained in accordance with the Fire Code.
- JJJ. Vehicular access shall be provided and maintained serviceable throughout construction to all required fire hydrants. All required fire hydrants shall be installed, tested and accepted or bonded prior to construction.
- KKK. Provide Fire Department or City-approved street signs and building addresses, and gate access codes prior to occupancy.
- LLL. Submit three copies of the final map to the Los Angeles County Fire Department for review and approval prior to recordation.
- MMM. Provide water mains, fire hydrants and fire flows as required by the County of Los Angeles Fire Department, for all land shown the map which shall be recorded.
- NNN. The required fire flow for public fire hydrants at this location is 2,000 gallons per minute at 20 psi for a duration of two hours, over and above maximum daily domestic demand. Two hydrants flowing simultaneously may be used to achieve the required fire flow.
- OOO. All hydrants shall measure 6" X 4" X 2-1/2", brass or bronze, conforming to current AWWA Standard C503, or an approved equal. All on-site hydrants shall be installed a minimum of 25 feet from a structure or protected by a two-hour rated firewall. Location: As per map on file with the Los Angeles County Fire Dapartment office. Install one new public fire hydrant adjacent to building "I" as shown on the Vesting Tentative Tract Map dated April 15, 2013. Install one new public fire hydrant on South Street, on the same side (south side) as the proposed development at the westerly property line.
- PPP. Additional water system requirements may be required when this land is further divided and/or during the building permit process.
- QQQ. A fee for park and recreational purposes in the amount of \$394,722.22 shall be paid to the City of Lakewood upon final inspection, or the date certificate of occupancy is issued, whichever occurs last.
- SECTION 6. A Certified copy of the excerpts of the minutes applicable to this case and this resolution shall be delivered to the applicant.

SECTION 5. The City Council finds and determines that said subdivision should be approved subject to the conditions set forth in Section 5 of said Resolution No. 11-2013, except as follows:

- A. The rear yard shall be not less than 25 feet as measured between the rear lot line, the side lot lines, and the nearest rear line of the main building or the nearest rear line of any accessory structure. No main buildings or accessory structures shall be constructed within the rear yard.
- B. The six-foot tall split-face masonry wall shown as on Exhibit Q of the Precise Plan shall be constructed along the southerly property line at a height of eight feet as measured from the finished grade, on either side thereof, at each point along the wall.
- C. Trees of a sufficient number, size, and growth rate shall be planted along the rear of the property to screen the adjacent tank farm facility from view from the proposed condomimums, to the satisfaction of the Director of Community Development.

- SECTION 3. That the development of the property in the manner set forth on the subject division of land will not unreasonably interfere with the free and complete exercise of any public entity and/or public utility rights of way and/or easements within the subject division of land, pursuant to Sections 66436(a) 3A (i-viii) of the Subdivision Map Act.
- SECTION 4. The on-site fire hydrant shall be a private fire hydrant installed and maintained in accordance with the conditions of approval by the Los Angeles County Fire Department.
- SECTION 5. Dedications as indicated on the final map for Tract No. 72071 are hereby accepted.
- SECTION 6. The City Clerk is instructed to endorse on the face of the map of Tract No. 72071 the certificate which embodies the approval of said map and acceptance of dedications shown thereon.

SUBJECT: Congestion Management Program (CMP) Conformance Self-Certification Process

STATEMENT OF FACTS

The Congestion Management Program is a required program that was created by the State Legislature with the passage of Assembly Bill 471 (1989), which became effective with voter approval of Proposition 111 in June 1990. The Congestion Management Program for Los Angeles County was developed by the Los Angeles County Metropolitan Transportation Authority ("MTA") and delivered to the cities in May 1992. The City of Lakewood has been complying with the requirements of the CMP since its implementation.

In September 2008, MTA Board of Directors approved the Congestion Mitigation Fee Feasibility Study to confirm the growth forecast and estimate project costs that could be the basis of a possible congestion mitigation fee program. The study was completed and in June 2013, the MTA Board of Directors approved a motion that directed MTA staff to work with their Sacramento delegation to explore legislative options to the state-mandated CMP. In March 2014, MTA staff met with various stakeholders to discuss the possible implementation of a CMP Fee and other potential alternatives for meeting the statutory requirements of the Congestion Management Program. Currently, MTA staff is evaluating these options. In the meanwhile, the existing local implementation responsibilities for the CMP will be in effect.

The 2010 Congestion Management Program adopted on October 28, 2010 requires that annually local jurisdictions submit:

- 1. A Local Development Report showing the development activity in the city from June 1, 2013 to May 31, 2014.
- 2. A resolution approved by the City Council at a noticed public hearing adopting the Local Implementation Report and self-certifying the City's conformance with local CMP requirements.

The City is in compliance with all local CMP requirements. A Land Use Resolution was adopted by the City Council on February 9, 1993. A Transportation Demand Management (TDM) ordinance was adopted by the City Council on February 23, 1993. The City continues to conduct semi-annual traffic counts on Lakewood Boulevard. Development activities are also being tracked and are the basis for the attached Local Development Report.

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF LAKEWOOD, CALIFORNIA, FINDING THE CITY TO BE IN CONFORMANCE WITH THE CONGESTION MANAGEMENT PROGRAM (CMP) AND ADOPTING THE CMP LOCAL DEVELOPMENT REPORT, IN ACCORDANCE WITH CALIFORNIA GOVERNMENT CODE SECTION 65089

WHEREAS, CMP statute requires the Los Angeles County Metropolitan Transportation Authority ("MTA"), acting as the Congestion Management Agency for Los Angeles County, to annually determine that the County and cities within the County are conforming to all CMP requirements; and

WHEREAS, MTA requires submittal of the CMP Local Development Report by September 1 of each year; and

WHEREAS, the City Council held a noticed public hearing on August 12, 2014.

NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Lakewood does hereby resolve as follows:

SECTION 1. That the City has taken all of the following actions, and that the City is in conformance with all applicable requirements of the 2010 CMP adopted by the MTA Board on October 28, 2010.

By June 15, of odd-numbered years, the City will conduct annual traffic counts and calculate levels of service for selected arterial intersections, consistent with the requirements identified in the CMP Highway and Roadway System chapter.

The City has locally adopted and continues to implement a transportation demand management ordinance, consistent with the minimum requirements identified in the CMP Transportation Demand Management chapter.

The City has locally adopted and continues to implement a land use analysis program, consistent with the minimum requirements identified in the CMP Land Use Analysis Program chapter.

The City has adopted a Local Development Report, attached hereto and made a part hereof, consistent with the requirements identified in the 2010 CMP. This report balances traffic congestion impacts due to growth within the City with transportation improvements, and demonstrates that the City is meeting its responsibilities under the Countywide Deficiency Plan consistent with the MTA Board adopted 2003 Short Range Transportation Plan.

SUBJECT: Declaration of Emergency Water Conservation Provisions

INTRODUCTION

On January 17, 2014, the Governor proclaimed a state of emergency due to the on-going drought conditions throughout the state. The Governor's emergency executive orders related to the drought granted the State Water Board authority to adopt regulations related to water use.

STATEMENT OF FACT

On July 29, 2014, the State Water Resources Control Board posted the emergency water conservation regulations as approved by the Office of Administrative Law. The final version contained several significant changes from the proposed regulations adopted at the State Board's July 15, 2014 meeting. While the original provisions directed water agencies to institute water use restrictions including limits on watering to two times per week or the institution of the utility's Water Shortage Contingency Plan, the final regulations promulgated the following:

- Water utilities with an approved Water Shortage Contingency Plan must "implement all requirements and actions of the stage of its water shortage contingency plan that imposes mandatory restrictions on outdoor irrigation of ornamental landscapes or turf with potable water." As an alternative an agency can submit an alternate plan for approval by the State Board, which according to State Board staff would be a difficult approval process. Those without an approved plan must implement outdoor water use restrictions that limit irrigation to two times per week.
- In addition, the Board approved a statewide prohibition on water runoff from irrigated areas, use of a hose to wash vehicles unless equipped with an automatic shut off nozzle, washing down hardscape areas, and use of potable water in fountains unless the water is part of a recirculating system. The regulations provide a mechanism for penalties up to \$500 for violation of these water use restrictions.

On July 22, 2014, the City Council adopted Resolution 2014-39, which reflected the State Board's proposed outdoor water use restrictions. Since the final regulations require the implementation of a specific phase of the City's Water Shortage Contingency Plan, staff requests that the Council rescind Resolution 2014-39 initiating water use restrictions and adopt a new resolution which implements Phase 2 of the Water Conservation Ordinance. Phase 2 of the Water Conservation Ordinance:

Declaration of Emergency Water Conservation Provisions August 12, 2014 Page 2

- Limits watering to three times per week in the summer months and two times per week during the winter months.
- Prohibits watering between 9:00AM and 5:00PM.
- Exempts parks, playing fields, commercial growers, golf course greens, landscape for fire, erosion and endangered species protection, environmental restoration projects, recycled water customers, water efficient landscape irrigation, such as rotor sprinklers with a 70% efficiency standard and drip irrigation. All general water use restrictions outlined in the Water Conservation Ordinance remain in effect.

The State Board has included a monthly reporting mechanism in the new regulations. Water utilities must supply the state with monthly production and a daily per capita calculation of water used by its customers for comparison to water use during 2013. The first report is due August 15, 2014, but the Department of Water Resources has not received any instruction regarding this provision.

SUMMARY

The Governor calls for a 20 percent reduction in water use. Lakewood's water use is up almost three percent from last year. To meet the state's requirements the City must initiate Lakewood's Water Shortage Contingency Plan at a level that requires mandatory water conservation measures. Phase 2 of the Water Conservation Ordinance meets this criterion.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends the City Council conduct a public hearing to gather testimony regarding mandatory water conservation provisions; rescind Resolution 2014-39; and adopt the proposed resolution.

RESOLUTION NO. 2014-54

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LAKEWOOD DECLARING THE IMPLEMENTATION OF WATER CONSERVATION MEASURES BY REASON OF REGULATIONS IMPOSED BY THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA

WHEREAS, 2014 is projected to become the driest year on record; and

WHEREAS, on January 17, 2014, the Governor proclaimed a state of emergency caused by the dry conditions, which called for Californians to reduce water use twenty percent (20%); and

WHEREAS, the State of California Water Resources Control Board (the "Board"), responding to the Governor's call for water conservation, has adopted emergency regulations which contain the following "Prohibited Activities in Promotion of Water Conservation:"

- "(a) To promote water conservation, each of the following actions is prohibited, except where necessary to address an immediate health and safety need or to comply with a term or condition an a permit issued by a state or federal agency:
 - (I) The application of potable water to outdoor landscapes in a manner that causes runoff such that water flows onto adjacent property, non-irrigated areas, private and public walkways, roadways, parking lots, or structures;
 - (2) The use of a hose that dispenses potable water to wash a motor vehicle, except where the hose is fitted with a shut-off nozzle or device attached to it that causes it to cease dispensing water immediately when not in use;
 - (3) The application of potable water to driveways and sidewalks; and
 - (4) The use of potable water in a fountain or other decorative water feature, except where the water is part of a recirculating system;" and

WHEREAS, the regulations adopted by the Board also require all urban water suppliers to implement restrictions contained in their water shortage contingency plans to conserve water; and

WHEREAS, the City has in effect an approved water shortage contingency plan, set forth in section 7511, et seq., of the Lakewood Municipal Code, which provides that the City Council can determine which conservation measures shall be implemented, and that the City Council shall implement such measures by adoption of a Resolution;

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LAKEWOOD DOES RESOLVE AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. The City Council hereby implements a Phase II Water Conservation Plan, as set forth in section 7511.1(F)(1) of the Lakewood Municipal Code, which provides as follows:

"Residential and commercial landscape areas shall be watered no more than three (3) times during a seven (7) day period for no more than ten (10) minutes at a time during the months of June, July, August and September, and prohibited during the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. Landscape irrigation shall be restricted to twice (2) during a seven (7) day period for no more than ten (10) minutes at a time during the months of October, November, December, January, February, March, April and May, and prohibited during the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. Landscape irrigation for commercial nurseries and growers, active parks and playing fields, school grounds, golf course greens, landscaping for fire and erosion protection, protecting endangered species, environmental mitigation projects, and properties using reclaimed water are exempt from this provision. Watering using a hand held bucket or similar container, a hose equipped with a shut off nozzle, a drip irrigation system with emitters producing no more than two (2) gallons per hour, weather based controllers or stream rotor sprinklers meeting a seventy percent (70%) efficiency standard, or running an irrigation system for short durations to make repairs are also exempt from the provision."

SECTION 2. The provisions of section 7511.1(F)(2) and 7511.1(J) are not being implemented at this time.

SECTION 3. The provisions hereof shall remain in effect until May 12, 2015, based on the current expiration date of the emergency regulations adopted by the Board, unless State action or changed circumstances cause the City Council to amend the actions taken in this Resolution prior to that date.

SECTION 4. Resolution No. 2014-39 is hereby rescinded.

ORDINANCE NO. 2014-7

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LAKEWOOD AMENDING THE LAKEWOOD MUNICIPAL CODE PERTAINING TO THE REMOVAL OF GUEST QUARTERS AS A PERMITTED USE IN THE R-1 (SINGLE-FAMILY RESIDENTIAL), R-A (SINGLE-FAMILY RESIDENTIAL-LIMITED AGRICULTURE), AND A (AGRICULTURE) ZONES

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LAKEWOOD DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. Article IX Planning - Zoning of the Lakewood Municipal Code is hereby amended as provided in this Ordinanee pursuant to Public Hearings before the Planning and Environment Commission and the City Council.

SECTION 2. <u>CEQA</u>. The City Council finds that an Initial Study has been prepared for the proposed project, pursuant to Section 15063 of the California Environmental Quality Act Guidelines, as amended. A Negative Declaration has been prepared for the project, pursuant to Section 15070, et. seq., of the CEQA Guidelines. The project was found to have no significant effect on the environment. Therefore, said Negative Declaration is hereby approved.

SECTION 3. <u>PURPOSE</u>. The purpose of this Ordinance is to remove guest quarters as a permitted use in the R-1 (Single-Family Residential), R-A (Single-Family Residential – Limited Agriculture), and A (Agriculture) zones.

SECTION 4. Section 9302. Definitions of Chapter 3 Zoning Purposes, Title and Definitions of Article IX of the Lakewood Municipal Code is amended by deleting Subsection 9302.25ab to read as follows:

Section 9302. DEFINITIONS.

9302.25ab. GUEST QUARTERS. A Guest Quarters is an accessory use with habitable area located on the same lot or parcel as an existing single-family dwelling, which provides dependent living facilities with limited amenities. Guest quarters may include provisions for living, sleeping, laundry and sanitation, but not cooking. Guest quarters shall comply with the following standards at all times:

- A. Guest quarters may be allowed, subject to an approved Conditional Use Permit as an accessory use to an existing single-family dwelling in any zone allowing single-family dwelling units.
- B. There shall not be a guest quarters on any lot or parcel with a second dwelling unit.
- C. Guest quarters shall be used for habitation only by the occupants of the existing single-family dwelling or their guests.

- D. There shall be no rent, remuneration or consideration of any kind received for the use of the guest quarters.
- E. Guest quarters may be attached to or detached from the existing single-family dwelling. If detached, the guest quarters shall not be less than five feet from any other structure on the property.
- F. Guest quarters shall not have a different postal address from that of the existing single-family dwelling.
- G. Guest Quarters Design Standards.
 - 1. The gross floor area shall not exceed 500 square feet.
 - 2. There shall be only one main living area.
 - 3. There may be one but no more than one separate bedroom.
 - 4. There may be closet areas, but these shall not exceed a cumulative total of 40 square feet.
 - 5. There may be a bathroom that does not exceed 80 square feet.
 - 6. There may be counter spaces that do not exceed a combined length of six feet.
 - 7. There may be cabinetry areas that do not exceed a combined length of six feet.
 - 8. There shall be no food preparation or cooking facilities.
 - 9. There shall be only a maximum of two single basin sinks allowed in the guest quarters, one in the bathroom and one either in the living area or the bedroom area.
- H. Utilities. Guest quarters shall not have metered utilities separate from that of the existing single-family dwelling, including electrical, gas and water services.
 - 1. There shall be no utility hookups installed that are designed for cooking facilities.
 - 2. Gas connections within the guest quarters shall be limited to water heaters, fireplaces, area heaters and/or a HVAC system.

SECTION 5. Section 9320. Uses Permitted of Part 2 R-I (Single-Family Residential) Zoning Regulations of Chapter 3 Zoning of Article 1X of the Lakewood Municipal Code is amended by deleting Subsection 9320.C.8 and by modifying Subsection 9322.7 to read as follows:

9320. USES PERMITTED:

- C. The following uses provided that in each instance a Conditional Use Permit has been obtained and continues in full force and effect.
 - 8. Guest quarters, providing no rent, remuneration or consideration is received for use of that space and as provided in Section 9302.25ab.

9322.7. ACCESSORY BUILDINGS.

Private garages or accessory buildings may be constructed within the five-foot rear yard as follows: No private garage or accessory building shall be located less than three (3) feet from the rear lot line and five (5) feet from the side lot line, except that any structure used as a private garage or accessory building, and located within the rear fifty percent (50%) of the lot may be located not less than one (1) foot from the side lot line, which does not abut a street, and provided that any drainage from its roof will fall on the lot on which the structure is located. Provided, further, that any accessory

building used or designed for human habitation shall be located not less than five (5) feet from the side lot line and rear lot line, and nNo accessory building or garage shall be located less than four (4) feet from the main building. No accessory structure, such as, but not limited to, sheds or storage containers or units, or greenhouses, except guest quarters authorized under Conditional Use Permit, shall be used as living quarters or recreational areas.

SECTION 6. Section 9326. Uses Permitted of Part 2a R-A (Single-Family Residential – Limited Agriculture) Zoning Regulations of Chapter 3 Zoning of Article IX of the Lakewood Municipal Code is hereby amended by modifying Subsection 9326.A.6, by deleting Subsection 9326.D.8, and by modifying Subsection 9326.9 to read as follows:

9326.A.6 USES PERMITTED:

- 6. Accessory buildings not used for living quarters with the exception that guest quarters may be allowed as provided in 9320.C.(8) and servant quarters may be allowed provided no remuneration for use of the space is received other than full-time domestic services on the premises.
- D. The following uses provided that in each instance a Conditional Use Permit has been obtained and continues in full force and effect.
 - 8. Guest quarters, providing no rent, remuneration or consideration is received for use of that space and as provided in Section 9302.25ab.

9326.9. ACCESSORY BUILDINGS.

Private garages or accessory buildings may be constructed within the five-foot rear yard as follows: No private garage or accessory building shall be located less than three (3) feet from the rear lot line and five (5) feet from the side lot line, except that any structure used as a private garage or accessory building, and located within the rear fifty percent (50%) of the lot may be located not less than one (1) foot from the side lot line, which does not abut a street, and provided that any drainage from its roof will fall on the lot on which the structure is located. Provided, further, that any accessory building used or designed for human habitation shall be located not less than five (5) feet from the side lot line and rear lot line, and nNo accessory building or garage shall be located less than four (4) feet from the main building. No accessory structure, such as, but not limited to, sheds or storage containers or units, or greenhouses, except guest quarters authorized under Conditional Use Permit, shall be used as living quarters-or recreational areas.

SECTION 7. Section 9386. Accessory Buildings of Part 8 General Provisions Relating to Yards, Height and Area of Chapter 3 Zoning of Article IX of the Lakewood Municipal Code is hereby amended by modifying Subsection 9386 to read as follows:

9386. ACCESSORY BUILDINGS. Accessory buildings may be constructed and maintained within the rear yard subject to the limitations and provisions of this Chapter, with the exception that no accessory building shall exceed one story in height unless authorized by conditional use permit, provided, in such a case, the height of the accessory building does not exceed the building height of the zone in which the same is located and provided further the permitted height is necessary to the use of said premises, is not detrimental to the surrounding properties or neighborhood, and provisions are made to secure adequate light, air and open space. No accessory structure, such as, but not limited to, sheds or storage containers or units, or greenhouses, except guest quarters authorized under Conditional Use Permit, shall be used as living quarters-or recreational areas.

SECTION 8. SEVERABILITY. The City Council hereby declares it would have passed this Ordinance sentence by sentence, paragraph by paragraph and section by section, and does hereby declare the provisions of this Ordinance are severable, and if for any reason any section of this Ordinance should be held invalid, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining parts of this Ordinance.

SECTION 9. CERTIFICATION. The City Clerk shall certify to the adoption of this Ordinance. The City Council hereby finds and determines there are no newspapers of general circulation both published and circulated within the City and, in compliance with Section 36933 of the Government Code, directs the City Clerk to cause said Ordinance within fifteen (15) days after its passage to be posted in at least three (3) public places within the City as established by ordinance. This Ordinance shall take effect thirty (30) days after its adoption.

INTRODUCTION

Staff has been working with Southern California Edison to gain approval of a modified use within the existing license agreement for Rynerson Park. An addendum to the existing license agreement is required.

STATEMENT OF FACT

Staff has worked with Architect Randy Meyer to design a dog park within the existing Rynerson Park footprint. A major portion of the dog park will be located on city owned property, however the easterly portion falls on SCE property. SCE presented staff with a number of conditions and specifications for use of their property, and staff provided a site plan and details that met those requirements. The plans and details have been approved by SCE, along with the proposed operating conditions and signage.

"Home Run Dog Park" will be located north of the little league fields at the northern end of Rynerson Park, and will extend the full width of the park northward to Del Amo Blvd. This is an excellent location for the dog park since this section of the park presently experiences minimal activity and is a considerable distance from any homes or businesses. The park will include a double gated entry area where users may enter and choose either the small or large dog side of the park. Fencing will be installed to separate the two areas. There will be waste bag dispensers, trash cans, drinking fountains for the dogs, and a limited number of benches at the entry area. The existing landscape of mature trees will shade both sides of the park. The existing terrain is sufficiently graded and at the outset, has established turf, although it is likely that the turf will be eventually worn away by use. The horse turn around area will be shortened to terminate south of the dog park and provide a separation between the dog and equine uses. Staff is presently obtaining quotes for the needed concrete and fence work, and the equipment and signage has been designed and ordered.

The addendum to the License Agreement has been reviewed by staff and the City Attorney.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that the City Council approve an Addendum to the License Agreement for Rynerson Park with Southern California Edison and authorize the Mayor to sign the addendum in a form approved by the City Attorney.
