3.1 • MEMBERSHIP IN THE GATEWAY CITIES AFFORDABLE HOUSING TRUST, A JOINT POWERS AUTHORITY

Abel Avalos, Director of Community Development, displayed slides and made a presentation based on the report in the agenda regarding the City's membership in the Gateway Cities Affordable Housing Trust, a Joint Powers Authority formed among the cities within the Gateway Cities region. Future financial impact, beginning July 1, 2024, was estimated at \$32,500. It was the recommendation of staff that the City Council adopt the proposed resolution approving the execution of the Joint Exercise of Powers Agreement relating to membership in the Gateway Cities Affordable Housing Trust; and authorize the Mayor to execute the Joint Exercise of Powers Agreement with the Gateway Cities Affordable Housing Trust.
