SUBJECT: Short Term Rentals

INTRODUCTION

On March 2, 2017, the City received a service request for the property located at 6610 Turnergrove Drive complaining that the property owners were operating a short-term-rental business.

On July 25, 2017, the City Council conducted a study session on this issue. The council accepted testimony from staff and both the property owner operating the short-term rental and the adjacent neighbors.

During the meeting, it was discussed that a primary issue with researching Airbnb and other short-term rental sites, was that exact addresses of rental locations were not listed on the website and that pictures did not include the outside of the home, so the only way to know the exact address was to book the rental. Some reasons supporting the regulation of short-term/home-share rentals were transformation of neighborhoods to communities of transients, increased public safety risks, noise issues, trash/parking problems, less availability of affordable housing and Transient Occupancy Tax (TOT) revenue. It was added that some cities had agreements with Airbnb so that renters pay TOT when booking a rental and Airbnb transferred the taxes to the partnering city. At the time of the hearing, there were six whole house vacation rentals, 39 room rentals and 13 shared room rentals.

The Council then heard testimony from both the property owner operating the short-term rental and the adjacent neighbors. The neighbors complained about not having the peaceful use of a quiet neighborhood and in addition problems with parking, traffic, litter, noise and having a continual parade of strangers in their neighborhood. The property owner stated that he had 81 reservations in a five-month period and that this helped make the mortgage payments. The City Council concluded by instructing staff to continually monitor this for another six months and then to report back to the council.

The monitoring was completed and only one additional address was reported during the review period. This second address was inspected by code enforcement staff and no problems were identified, nor could staff confirm the use of the property as a short-term rental. Therefore during the review period only one property has been reported to the city regarding alleged problems with the use of a home for short-term rental. The Turnergrove Drive property owner

has moved out his for personal reasons and the conflicts with his neighbors. He has chosen to convert the Turnergrove property into a whole house short-term rental.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

City staff is requesting direction from the City Council regarding the need for regulations of short-term rentals in the City of Lakewood. Lakewood does not have as many active short-term rentals as other cities and to date there has only been one residence with a confirmed complaint raised about the operation of a short-term rental business.

However, both whole house and home share rentals share the potential to bring problems to established single-family residential neighborhoods without proper regulations. Such regulations would reduce or prohibit problems identified in other jurisdictions such as: "party house" rentals, non-compliance with parking, litter, street sweeping and trash day regulations. The requirement for a Transient Occupancy Tax could partially offset additional municipal expenses created by the operation of the short-term rental businesses and their guests. Registration of guests would allow identification of guests for public safety and health emergency situations. A short-term rental ordinance could contain regulations such as:

- · Ban the short-term rentals of whole homes.
- · Require home-share short-term rentals of one or more rooms to be only within owner-occupied residences.
- · Limit the rental of any rooms in any one house to be no more than 90 days collectively in any calendar year.
- · Require all parking for a home share short-term rental operation be provided on site.
- Require the home share residence to be in full compliance with all building codes and the Lakewood Municipal Code.
- · Require a business license for a short-term rental business.
- Require short-term rentals could be subject to the established Transient Occupancy of 8% and a \$100 annual business license fee.
- · Require short-term rental operators to have their guests to register with identification, similar to a hotel or motel.

It should be noted that rental of rooms within a home for more than 30 days would not subject to these restrictions, as they are allowed by the municipal code.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that the City Council instruct staff whether to proceed with preparation of a Short-term Rental Ordinance for consideration by the Planning and Environment Commission and to provide staff direction as to the appropriate elements of such regulation.

Jurisdiction	Summary of Regulations
Los Angeles County Cities	
Artesia	No regulations on rentals of single-family homes or condo units. No business license required for such rentals.
Avalon	STRs, called "transient rentals," are allowed in any zone with a CUP. A business license is required. 12% TOT. A contact person must be provided who is available 24/7 on Catalina Island. STRs in the flatter parts of the city cannot include the use of a vehicle. No maximum duration.
Bell	The code is silent on STRs, so they are not allowed (also, not defined). However, the issue has not come up. No regulations on the number of rooms, number of people or maximum amount of time for long-term home rentals.
Bell Gardens	The code is silent on STRs, so the use is not permitted and STRs are not defined. ADUs that are rented must be rented for longer than 30 days. For longer-term home rentals with an owner-occupant, there are no limits on the number of rooms rented or the number of renters and there is no maximum duration. However, for properties with 1-3 dwelling units, 2 parking spaces are required per unit plus 1 additional space for every room that is rented out in an owner-occupied unit. No business license required.
Bellflower	No limit on number of rooms that can be rented with owner occupancy. Entire home can be rented if not occupied by owner. Owner-occupancy requirement does exist for properties with ADUs. No limit on number of renters in a unit. No time limit for rentals. Business license is required for all home
	rentals. No new ordinance reacting to online home rental sites.

Cerritos	STRs are prohibited, defined as rentals of 31 days or less in a residential zone, not in a cityapproved hotel. Boarding houses are allowed by right, defined as long-term rentals with owner occupancy. For boarding houses, maximum of two boarders, business license required, no maximum amount of time.
Commerce	The code is silent on this issue, therefore STRs are prohibited. For longer-term rentals a business license is required. For room rentals with an owner-occupant there is not maximum number or rooms, number of people or amount of time.
Compton	There is no specific prohibition on STRs, therefore they are allowed, since home rentals in general are allowed. A business license is required to rent homes in general. There is no limit on number of rooms, number of people or amount of time.
Cudahy	Code is silent, therefore STRs are not allowed.
Downey	The code is silent on STRs, so they are prohibited. For home rentals in general there is no limit on the number of rooms, number of people or amount of time.

El Segundo	STRs are not allowed. STRs are defined as renting a residence for not more than 30 days. Staff is working on an ordinance which would permit STRs and require a STR permit, business license, inspection by the Fire Department, and payment of TOT. Proposed ordinance would require property owner to live on site during the STR. May take a "party house" ordinance to the council first to try and address concerns about noise in residential areas in general. Has a short-term rental survey posted to the City website: http://www.elsegundo.org/news/displaynews. asp?NewsID=2910&TargetID=1. For long-term rentals with an owner occupant no more than two rooms may be rented out to no more than four people with no maximum amount of time. No business license is required to rent a single residence. Code enforcement on STRs is difficult and expensive, so regulating and taxing may be more effective. South Bay COG meets monthly on the issue of STRs.

Hawaiian Gardens	A business license is required for all residential rentals. ADUs that are rented must be rented for at least 30 days and owner occupancy must be maintained in one of the two units with no lapses longer than 30 days. However, the ADU ordinance has not been updated to align with the new state laws, so it may be invalid.
Hermosa Beach	STRs are prohibited. STRs are defined as renting a dwelling for less than 30 consecutive days. For long-term rentals with an owner-occupant there are no limits on the number of rooms, people or maximum time. No business license is required to rent a single dwelling.
Industry	Not applicable, since there is hardly any residential land.

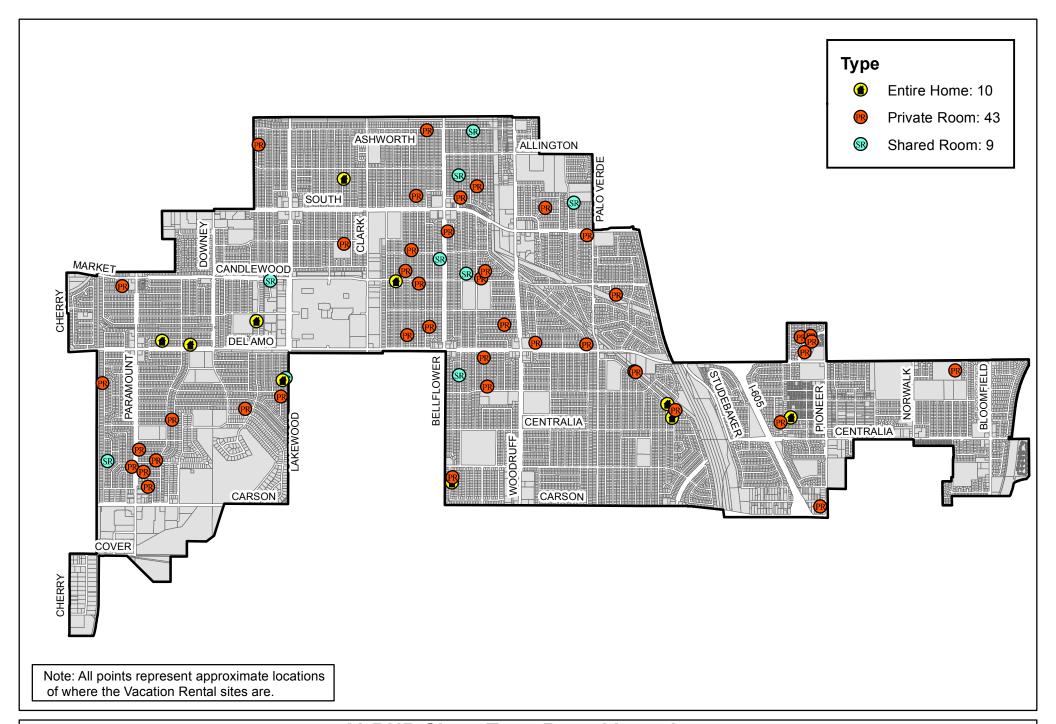
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La Mirada	The code is silent on the issue of short term rentals, therefore they are allowed, since rentals in general are allowed. No more than two rental agreements may be in effect at any given time for a single dwelling unit. A business license is required, there is no maximum number of rooms, people or time for home rentals.

Lakewood	Code is silent on STRs. R-1 zone, owner- occupied home: okay to rent up to two rooms to up to two people or entire house without time limits. No business license needed for SFR rentals. M-F-R zone: bed and breakfasts allowed with CUP. C-4 zone: hotels, motels and extended-stay hotels allowed with CUP. Hotels and motels are not allowed in manufacturing zones.
Long Beach	STRs, defined as rentals of 30 days or less, not in a city-approved hotel, are prohibited. They are in the early stages of working on an ordinance that might allow and tax STRs.
Los Angeles	"Renting out a home or room for less than 30 days at a time is currently illegal in many residential areas of Los Angeles, according to planning officials. But as the phenomenon has exploded with the rise of Airbnb and similar platforms that allow hosts to offer rooms or entire homes to travelers, those rules have rarely been enforced" (Reyes, 2017). The City came to an agreement with Airbnb to collect TOT from its hosts, which generated over \$42 million last year. The City is considering an ordinance to allow and regulate STRs. This ordinance would most likely allow for STRs by right up to a certain number of days per year (proposals range from 90 to 180 days), with a discretionary process like a CUP for STRs more than that number of days per year.

Malibu	
Manhattan Beach	"Short-term Vacation Rentals" have been prohibited since 2015. STRs are defined as rentals of homes in residential zones for less than 30 days. Existing permitted STRs had a phase-out period. The Community Development receptionist I spoke with mentioned that enforcement has been challenging and that the Council will take up this issue again on Tuesday 2/20/2018.
Norwalk	The whole home can be rented out. If the owners are currently occupying the home, they can bring in up to four renters in up to two rooms. There is no time limit on such rentals. No business license is required for home rentals unless the business is renting out four or more units.
Paramount	The code is silent on STRs, so they are not allowed (also, not defined). There are no limits on number of rooms, number of people or a maximum amount of time that homes can be rented. No business license is required to rent out a single unit. The City has had this issue come up and may start work on an ordinance soon.
Pasadena	The code is silent on STRs, so they are not allowed (also, not defined). For long-term rentals, up to two bedrooms may be rented out while the residence is owner-occupied. No caps on the number of people and no maximum time for long-term rentals. The City is working on an ordinance to define, allow and regulate STRs and has already done some public outreach.
Redondo Beach	The code is slient on STRs. Hotels and motels are only allowed in commercial zones, and are defined as renting out rooms for 30 days or less. Therefore, STRs are not allowed in residential zones.

Santa Fe Springs	Code is silent on the issue and planning staff have not encountered this issue in practice. There are no limits on the number of rooms, number of people or maximum duration of rentals. A business license is not required for renting a single unit, but at a certain point a license is required (talk to Finance Department).	
Santa Monica	"Home-Sharing" is allowed with a business license. This is renting a room or rooms in a home for 30 days or less. The owner is required to live in the home where rooms are being rented out. A TOT of 14% must be paid. "Vacation Rentals" are not allowed. Vacation rentals are rentals of a dwelling unit in whole or in part for 30 days or less. Renting out a residence is okay if for 31 days or more with a business license, but TOT does not apply in this situation.	
Signal Hill	Code is silent on STRs, therefore they are not allowed. There are no limits on number of rooms, number of people or a maximum amount of time for longer-term rentals. No business license is required for long-term rentals of a single housing unit.	
Vernon	Not applicable, since there is hardly any residential land.	
Whittier	STRs are not regulated. No regulations are in the works.	

Orange County Cities	
Anaheim	STRs are prohibited effective 8/11/2016. A separate ordinance implemented an 18-month phase-out of existing permitted STRs. STRs are defined as renting all or a portion of a dwelling for a period of less than 30 consecutive days, except in city-approved hotels.
Cypress	The code is silent on STRs, so they are not allowed (also, not defined). No regulations on the number of rooms, number of people or maximum amount of time for long-term home rentals.

Fullerton	Regulations being proposed. Sets the max number per neighborhood.		
Huntington Beach	"Short-term vacation rentals" are prohibited. STRs are defined as renting a home for less than 30 consecutive days. Running an illegal STR is punishable by a fine of up to \$1,000 per day per violation. STRs are prohibited because they are not listed as a permitted use in the code in residential areas. Short-term lodging is only allowed in commercial zones as a bed and breakfast or a hotel. For an owner-occupant renting out a home or portion of a home there are no limits on number of rooms, number of people or maximum amount of time. No business license is required to rent out a single residence.		
Irvine			
La Palma	The code is silent on STRs, so they are not allowed (also, not defined). No regulations on the number of rooms, number of people or maximum amount of time for long-term home rentals.		
Laguna Beach			
Newport Beach	STRs are allowed in the R-1.5, R-2 and RM zones with a "short-term lodging permit" and a business license. Standard conditions include having a local contact person available 24/7, limiting the rental to a specific number of people, managing guests in terms of noise & trash, etc. 10% TOT.		
Seal Beach	STRs are not allowed. STRs are defined as renting a home for 29 days or less. STRs were allowed until 2014 with a CUP. Those STRs which have CUPs can continue as nonconforming uses. For owner-occupants renting rooms long-term, no maximum number of rooms, tenants, or maximum time. A business license is required to rent out a single dwelling unit.		

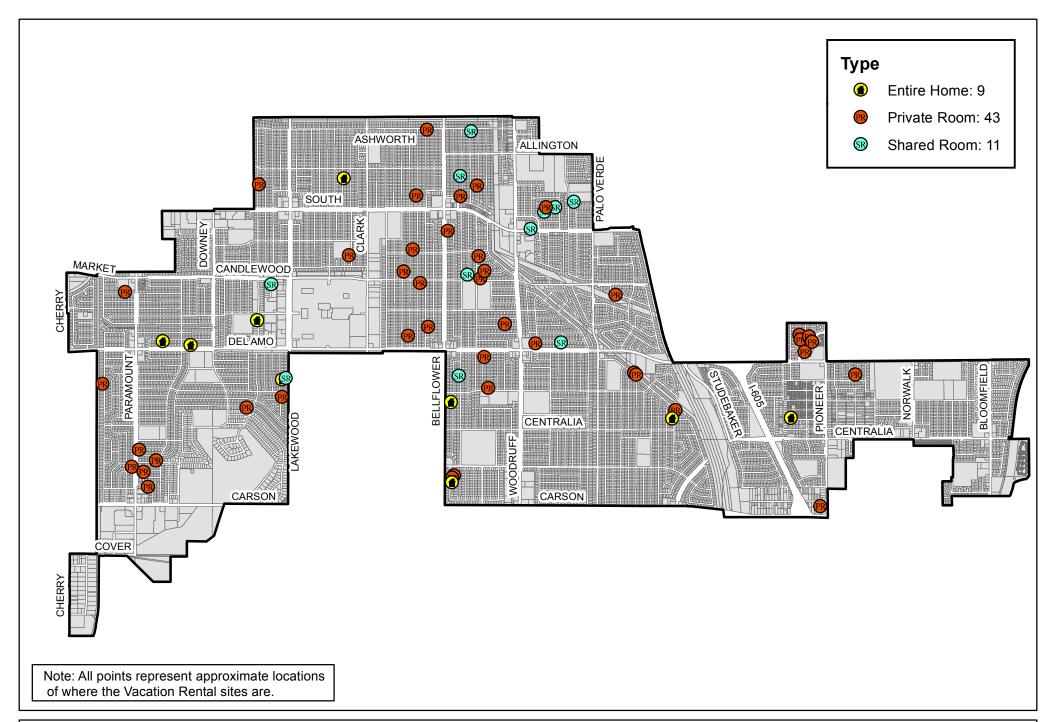




AirBNB Short-Term Rental Locations 7/8/2017

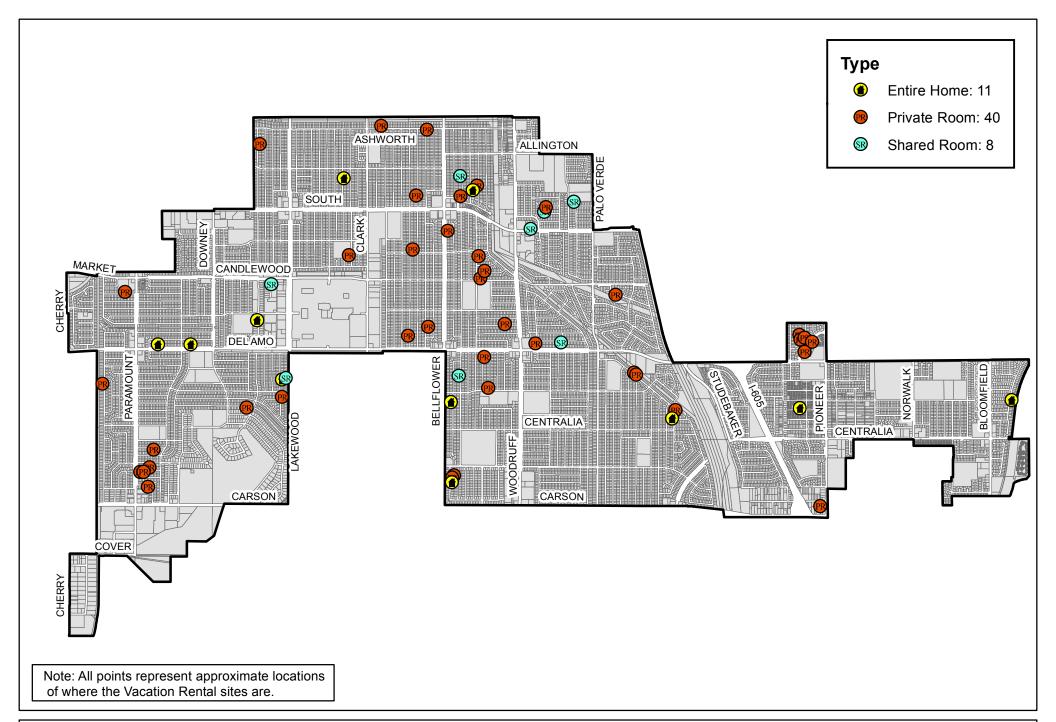




AirBNB Short-Term Rental Locations 9/5/2017

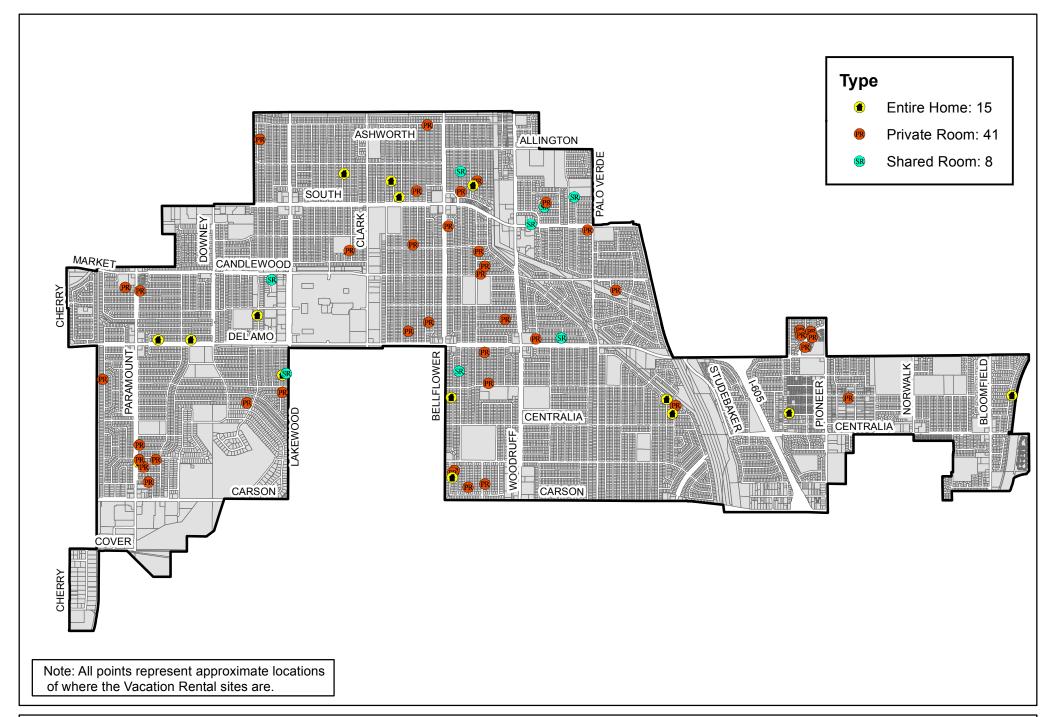




AirBNB Short-Term Rental Locations 11/6/2017

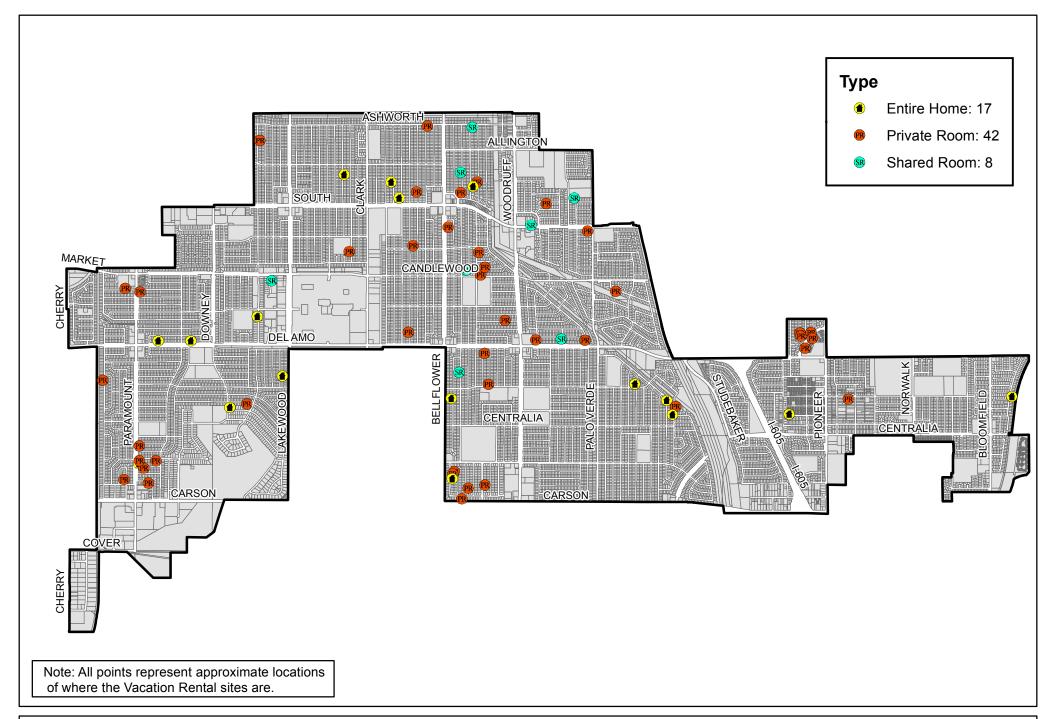




AirBNB Short-Term Rental Locations 12/4/2017

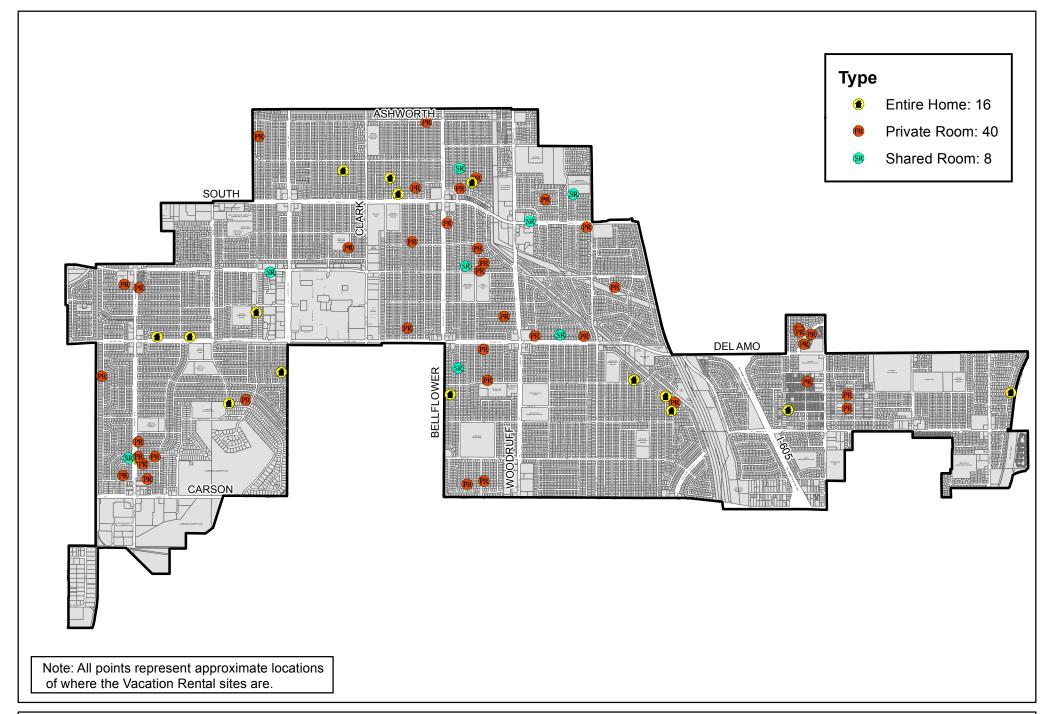




AirBNB Short-Term Rental Locations 1/5/2018

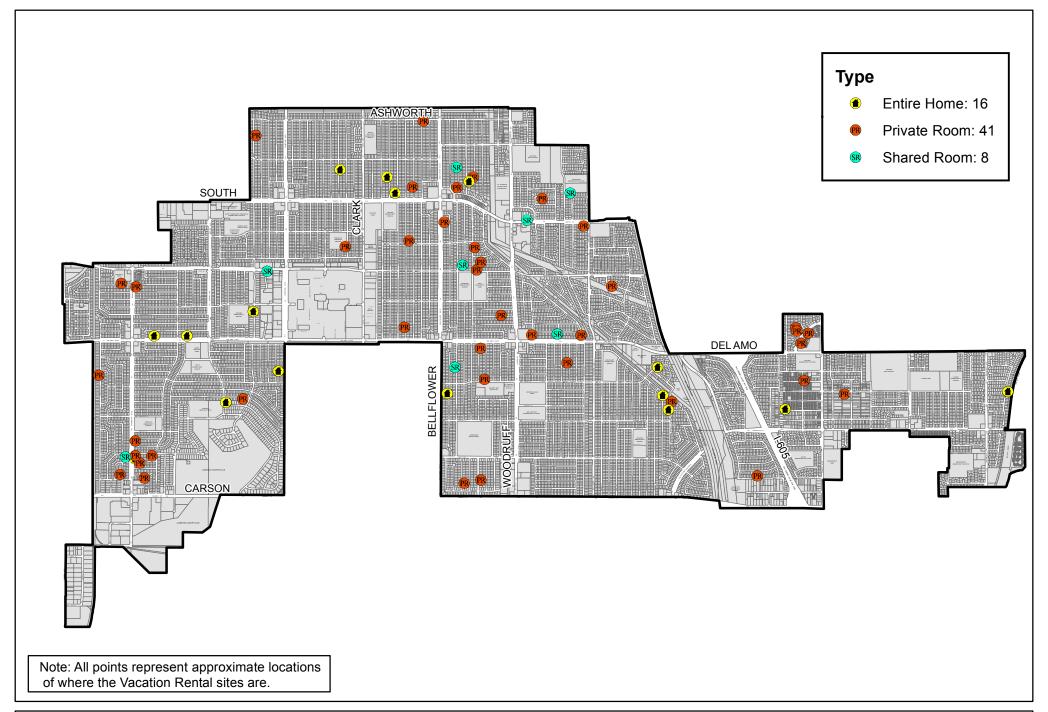




AirBNB Short-Term Rental Locations 2/2/2018

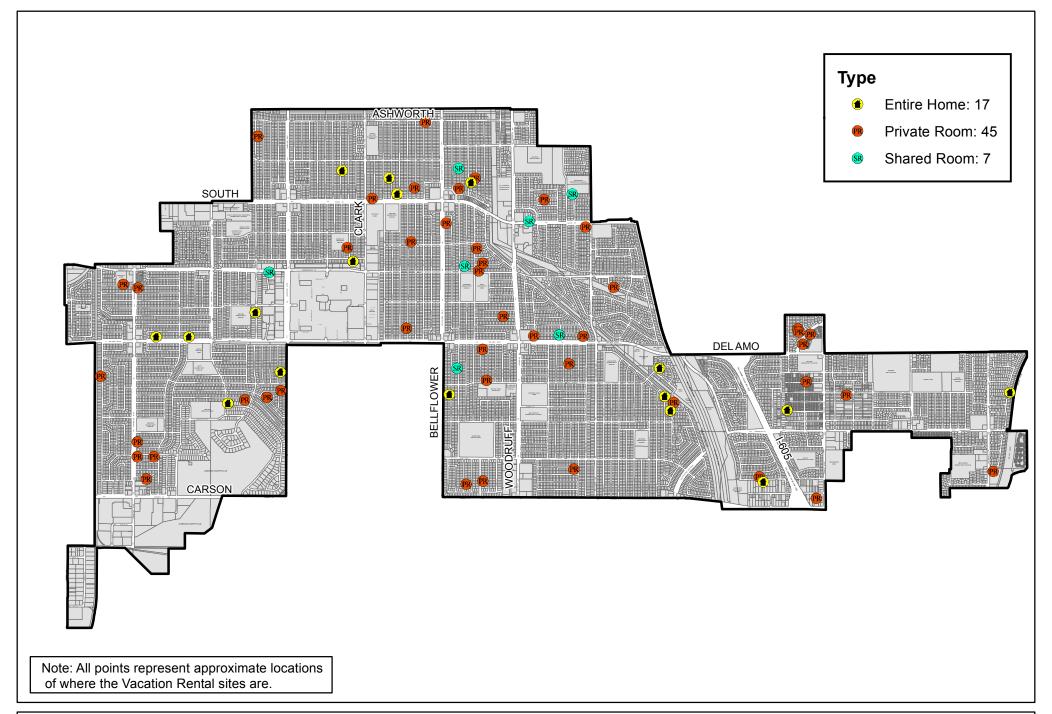










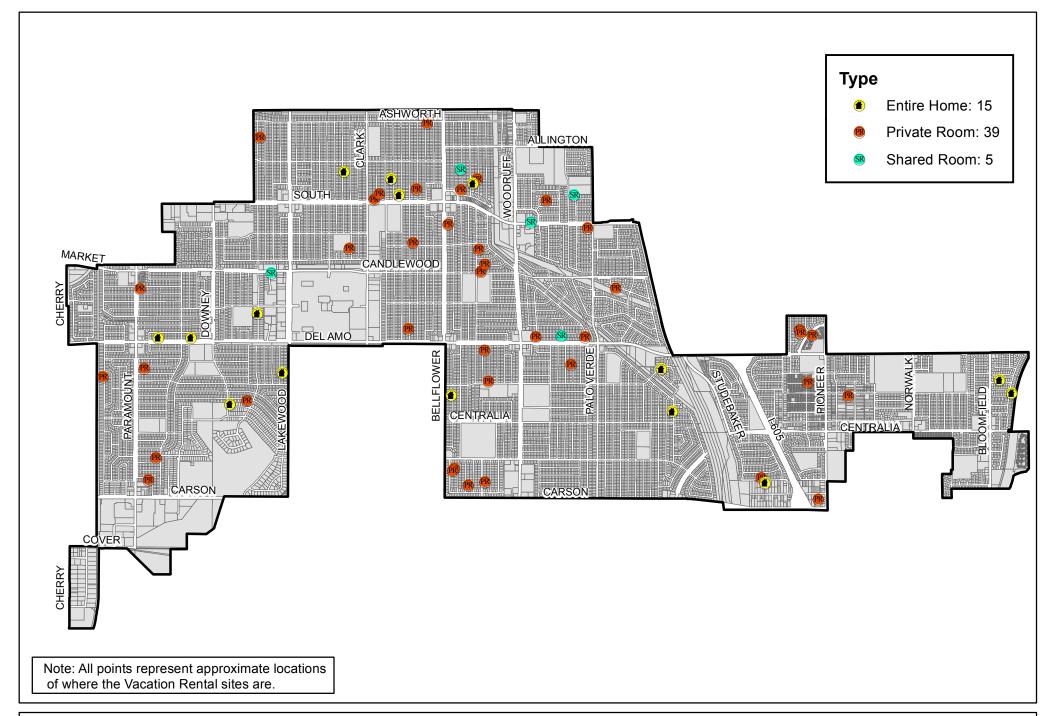




AirBNB Short-Term Rental Locations 4/3/2018

SUBJECT: Accessory Dwelling Units (ADUs)

INTRODUCTION

The State of California has adopted several laws mandating local jurisdictions to allow Accessory Dwelling Units (ADU's) in most residential neighborhoods. The purpose of this ordinance is to implement California State Senate Bill 1069 (SB 1069) (Chapter 720, Statutes 2016); Assembly Bill 2299 (AB 2299) (Chapter 735, Statutes 2016); Assembly Bill 2406 (AB 2406) (Chapter 735, Statutes 2016); Senate Bill 229 (Chapter 594, Statutes 2017) and Assembly Bill 494 (Chapter 602, Statutes 2017) through the implementation of regulations that comply with state law concerning Accessory Dwelling Units (ADU's) in residential zones.

State lawmakers are concerned about the dwindling supply of affordable housing units in the State of California. They have enacted a number of laws to authorize the development of ADU's on residential properties as one solution to increase the supply of housing. The State Legislature adopted these laws in order to eliminate barriers to ADU construction, a use that the Legislature has determined to be a cost-effective approach to address housing shortages and to encourage infill development within existing neighborhoods.

ADU's are additional independent living quarters constructed on residential lots that have existing primary dwelling units. They may be attached to or detached from primary dwelling units. They provide a completely independent living facility, including facilities for living, sleeping, eating, cooking, and sanitation. They may be occupied by a family member or rented to a tenant, but cannot be sold separately from the main residence. ADUs are also referred to as second units, accessory apartments, accessory dwellings, mother-in-law units, or granny flats.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

The Community Development Department has received approximately 60 ADU related inquiries since passage of the first ADU law. There are two ADUs under construction and more have been reviewed by the Development Review Board or are now in plan check. In reviewing the ADU plans submitted to the City, staff has observed several shortcomings that would be detrimental to the community if development of ADUs is allowed to continue without proper development standards. Below are the primary concerns that could be corrected with the adoption of an ordinance regulating ADUs:

- ADU applications received so far are in lots that provide the required 750 square feet of open space in the rear yard for the existing single family residence. However, such open

space is often inadequately laid out because open areas are irregular, narrow, or interrupted by off-street parking areas, structures, and other obstacles. No open space is provided for the ADU.

- ADUs contained on the second floor of accessory structures have the potential to unnecessarily negatively impact surrounding properties with respect to inadequate light, airflow, and enjoyment of open space due to impaired privacy.
- A lack of uniform development standards for ADUs may result in structures that are incompatible with the community with respect to architectural style, building height, setbacks, lot coverage, and open space. Standards for ADU size, internal functionality, unit amenities, and other features must also be addressed to avoid substandard housing conditions.
- The State is concerned about access to affordable housing yet the ADU laws do nothing to prevent an ADU from becoming a short-term rental. The use of ADUs as short-term rentals undermines the intent of State law as well as Lakewood's efforts to meet its Regional Housing Needs Assessment. If Lakewood is mandated to allow ADUs by the State, the City should take full advantage of this mandate by claiming any new ADUs as credit for new housing production.
- Introducing ADUs to older, established communities should require an assessment of the adequacy of utilities to ensure that the utilities can support the additional demand when possible. It should be the responsibility of the developer to provide proof of the adequacy of utilities.

Staff has prepared the attached draft ordinance that addresses the issues outlined above. The draft ordinance would establish development standards for ADU's, as follows:

- ADU's would be subject review by the Development Review Board for design and architectural compatibility.
- · ADU's would only allowed on a lot with a properly permitted owner-occupied dwelling unit
- No part of an ADU would not be allowed on the upper floor of a two-story accessory structure.
- The minimum lot size currently in the code is not allowed by the State. The ordinance would ask that the sites that add an ADU comply with the minimum lot size currently existing on the code for new single family residences.
- The minimum floor area would be 460 feet, which is the minimum size the city currently requires for a senior apartment.
- The maximum floor area would be 1,200 square feet for a detached ADU, or if attached, no more than 50% of the existing home. Attached ADUs should have a separate exterior entrance from the primary residence.

- The primary residence should be required to maintain two off-street parking spaces.
- ADU's should be required to have 650 square feet of contiguous and useable open space in addition to the 750 square feet for the primary residence, with minimum dimensions of 10 feet. The 650 square feet of open space matches the requirement for a multi-family dwelling unit. The 750 square-foot requirement is currently in effect in the R-1 and R-A zones.
- For units that are rented or leased, there should be a minimum rental period of not less than 30 days to discourage ADUs from being used as short-term rentals.
- A Notice of Condition could be required to be recorded documenting the conditions for an ADU and to notify future homebuyers that the property must be owner-occupied.

SUMMARY

The ADU laws past by the State have the potential to be detrimental to Lakewood in the absence of development standards tailored to Lakewood's unique characteristics.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that the City Council instruct staff to proceed with preparation of an Accessory Dwelling Unit (ADU) Ordinance for consideration by the Planning and Environment Commission.

SUBJECT: Report of City Council Committees' Activities

INTRODUCTION

A brief update is provided for City Council review on the activities of the following standing committees: Audit and Public Safety Committees.

STATEMENT OF FACT

On May 7, the Audit Committee met and discussed:

- Best Practices The roles and responsibilities of the committee, city staff and the independent auditing firm (The Pun Group). The committee was presented with an engagement timeframe for the FY 2017/2018 audit:
 - ✓ Interim Start Date: May 7, 2018
 - ✓ Year-end Start Date: September 10, 2018
 - ✓ CAFR November 30, 2018
 - ✓ Single Audit Report November 30, 2018
- Auditor's Approach The auditing firm has a four-phase approach of (1) Detail Planning; (2) Risk Based Review of Internal Control Systems and Compliance; (3) Validation of Account Balances; and (4) Financial Statements Preparation and Audit Opinion
- Government Accounting Standards Board (GASB) Pronouncements GASB 75 "Accounting & Financial Reporting for Postemployment Benefits other than Pensions" is effective for FY 17/18 after June 15, 2017. GASB 87 "Leases" is effective for FY 20/21 after December 15, 2019.
- The Committee received a report on the Invitation to Comment (ITC) on two subjects pertaining to potential GASB pronouncements: (1) Financial Reporting Model Improvement Government Funds and (2) Revenue and Expense Recognition.
- The Committee was afforded the opportunity to speak directly with the Auditors, without the presence of City staff.

On May 10, the Public Safety Committee met and discussed:

• Crime Trend/Statistics —Crime numbers were down for the first four months of 2018 compared to 2017. There were 27 porch thefts and 13 mail/package thefts from January to April. The Committee directed Public Safety articles be created requesting residents to report package thefts.

April. The Committee directed Public Safety articles be created requesting residents to report package thefts.

- Lakewood Center Mall There was a significant decrease in grand theft autos. Two burglaries occurred in April. Mall security, theater security and LASD participated in an active shooter training, which proved to be a valuable exercise. The Committee requested notifying the public in future articles the importance of keeping their hands visible so that they do not appear as a threat if they were ever in an active shooter incident.
- Public Outreach Lakewood Living Magazinc features quarterly crime data, and Public Safety profiles will be added to highlight deputies and firefighters to the Lakewood citizenry. Crime maps with year-to-date information will be published in the c-magazine with the next quarterly Public Safety report by Captain Harpham.
- Illegal Fireworks Enforcement New hard-hitting, attention-grabbing graphics warning of the injuries and damage caused by illegal fireworks have been published and will be distributed by fireworks stands. The Committee recommended reaching out to the Chamber of Commerce to provide these flyers to businesses. The committee also approved renting four digital message boards for one month to disperse throughout the City at busy intersections warning of the fines for illegal fireworks possession/use. There will be additional charges for illegal fireworks use/possession citations up to total costs of approximately \$2,000. Letters will be sent to illegal fireworks citation recipients from the last three years advising that Sheriff's personnel will patrol their neighborhoods; Fourth of July deployment will include additional deputies and vehicles. Upcoming Public Safety communication material will encourage residents to call the city hotline to report known or suspected illegal firework use locations.
- Fireworks Stand Permits Review 25 organizations completed the application process to have fireworks stands and was forwarded to the Lakewood City Council for approval.
- Revocation of Business License for Massage Establishment the business license of Oasis Foot Spa & Massage was revoked.

In accordance with California Government Code Section 53607, the City Council has delegated to the City Treasurer the responsibility to invest or to reinvest funds, or to sell or exchange securities so purchased. The California Government Code Section 53607 requires that, if such responsibility has been delegated, then the Treasurer "shall make a monthly report of those transactions to the legislative body." In compliance with this requirement, the Montbly Report of Investment Transactions is being rendered to be received and filed.

SUBJECT: Low-Income Exemption from Utility Users Tax

INTRODUCTION

The City Council has established certain classes of exemptions from the Utility Users Tax, including service users who qualify for low-income exemptions.

STATEMENT OF FACT

Resolution No. 92-36, which established a low-ineome exemption based on a service user's total annual income and household size, was last amended on May 23, 2017 by Resolution No. 2017-13. Said resolution updated eligibility income criteria, as defined by the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC). Likewise, the attached resolution increases the amount of annual income to be used in determining exemption criteria from the utility users tax effective June 1, 2018. Adoption of this resolution will align the income criteria used by the City to the current levels as set by the CPUC.

The table below illustrates the various income limits (depending on the household size) over the last three years and the percentage increases.

SUBJECT: Permit Applications for Sale of Fireworks

INTRODUCTION

Sections 3105 through 3106 of the Lakewood Municipal Code identify the requirements to be met and the procedures to be followed by applicants for a permit to sell fireworks. Since the Fire Prevention Ordinance was amended in 2002, the number of firework stand permits has declined from 36 in 2001 to 25 in 2018.

STATEMENT OF FACT

For the first time since the adoption of Ordinance 2002-2 the number of applications dropped below the maximum (25) due to two organizations (AYSO and Royal Rangers) ending their firework stand operations. As a result, the Administrative Services Department, with direction from the City Attorney, conducted a drawing pursuant to Section 3103.3.D of the Lakewood Municipal Code to select an organization for the open permit.

The Administrative Services Department contacted the eight (8) organizations that had previously contacted the City expressing interest in operating a firework stand. Of the eight organizations contacted, six (6) submitted completed applications to the City Clerk within the time allotted, and three (3) of those six, met the criteria for stand operation per Lakewood Municipal Code Section 3105.3. The City Clerk held a witnessed drawing on April 30th and Lakewood Little League's name was drawn. On May 7th, Lakewood Little League submitted their stand application and on May 10th the Public Safety Committee, acting as the License and Permit Hearing Board, reviewed all the fireworks stand permit applications and authorized staff to bring all 25 permit applications to the City Council for approval.

The other 24 organizations seeking permits are the same groups the City Council approved in 2017. All organizations have suhmitted the proper documentation as required by the Fire Prevention Code. Following is a list of all 25 organizations and their scheduled stand locations.

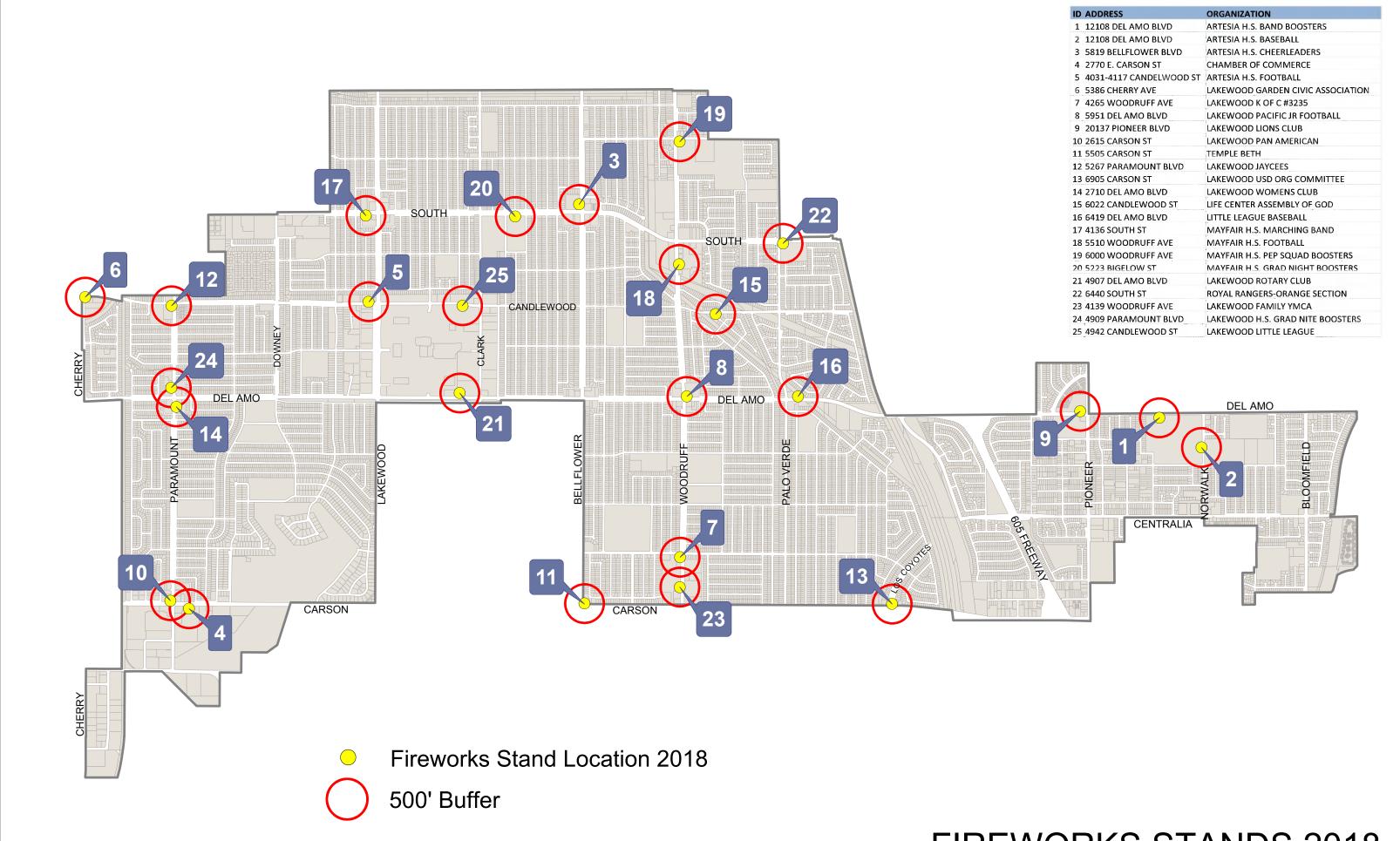

SUBJECT: Notice of Completion – Public Works Contract 18-01

Lakewood City Hall Boiler Replacement

INTRODUCTION

Allison Mechanical, Inc., the Contractor on Public Works Contract 18-01, has completed work which consisted of demolition of existing and new improvements including a replacement hot water boiler, and related items required by the contract documents.

STATEMENT OF FACT

On March 13, 2018 Council awarded Public Works Contract 2018-01 to Allison Mechanical, Inc. in the amount of \$61,499. Two (2) change orders (COs) were negotiated throughout the construction period resulting in a final contract amount of \$65,364.51. The net additional amount to the contract was \$3,865.51. These change orders are the result of expediting the equipment for faster installation, and replacing a leaking circuit setter.

The contract was substantially completed on April 30th, 2017. Since that time Allison Mechanical, Inc.'s staff has addressed all items on a limited punch list.

RECOMMENDATION

It is the recommendation of Staff that the City Council:

- (1) Accept the work performed by Allison Mechanical, Inc., in a final contract amount of \$65,364.51, and authorize the City Clerk to file the Notice of Completion for Public Works Contract 2018-01.
- (2) Ratify Change Order Nos. 1-2 in the net additional amount of \$3,865.51 to Public Works Contract 2018-01.

SUBJECT: Agreement Between the Los Angeles Gateway Region Integrated Regional Water Management Joint Powers Authority (GWMA) and the City of Lakewood for Cost Sharing for the Installation of Monitoring Equipment and Monitoring Pursuant to the Harbor Toxic Pollutants Total Maximum Daily Load (TMDL)

BACKGROUND

In 2012, the Harbor Toxics TMDL, incorporated into the Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System (MS4) Permit. This TMDL establishes numerical discharge limits for a wide variety of pollutants including metals such as copper, lead, and zinc. Cities impacted by this TMDL are draining to the Dominguez Channel; directly into the Greater Harbor which includes the Los Cerritos Channel watershed, Palos Verdes Peninsula watershed and Los Angeles River Estuary; and draining to the Los Angeles and San Gabriel Rivers, which includes Lakewood.

In 2015, Lakewood entered into a cost sharing agreement with the GWMA as the fiduciary agent for the installation of monitoring equipment and monitoring the Harbor Toxics TMDL, and that is set to expire on June 30, 2018. This new agreement will expire on June 30, 2023.

FISCAL IMPACT

A cost share matrix is included in Exhibit A to the Agreement. This cost share estimate based on a 50% equal share and 50% by area in addition to a 3% administrative GWMA member fee to administer the Agreement. Non-members pay a 8.76% administrative fee. The City's annual cost is \$3,309.50 for FY2018-19 and in the future cost may change slightly dependent on the number of participants.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that City Council:

1. Authorize the Mayor to enter into a five (5) year agreement between the City and GWMA for administration and cost sharing for the installation of monitoring equipment and ongoing monitoring for the Harbor Toxic Pollutant Total Maximum Daily Load.

AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE LOS ANGELES GATEWAY REGION INTEGRATED REGIONAL WATER MANAGEMENT JOINT POWERS AUTHORITY AND THE CITY OF LAKEWOOD

FOR COST SHARING FOR THE INSTALLATION OF MONITORING EQUIPMENT AND MONITORING PURSUANT TO THE HARBOR TOXIC POLLUTANTS TMDL

This Agreement is made and entered into as of July 1, 2018, by and between the Los Angeles Gateway Region Integrated Regional Water Management Joint Powers Authority ("GWMA"), a California Joint Powers Authority, and the City of Lakewood, (the "Permittee"). The Permittee and the GWMA are collectively referred to as the "Parties";

RECITALS

WHEREAS, the mission of the GWMA includes the equitable protection and management of water resources within its area;

WHEREAS, for the purposes of this Agreement, the term "MS4 Permittees" shall mean those public agencies that are co-permittees to a National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System Permit Order ("MS4 Permit") issued by the Los Angeles Regional Water Quality Control Board;

WHEREAS, the United States Environmental Protection Agency established the Total Maximum Daily Loads ("TMDL") for Toxic Pollutants on March 23, 2012, with the intent of protecting and improving water quality in the Dominguez Channel and the Greater Los Angeles and Long Beach Harbor Waters ("Harbor Toxic Pollutants TMDL");

WHEREAS, the Harbor Toxic Pollutants TMDL regulates certain discharges from National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System ("NPDES") permit holders, requiring organization and cooperation among the MS4 Permittees;

WHEREAS, the Permittee manages, drains or conveys storm water into at least a portion of the Los Angeles River including the estuary or Coyote Creek or the San Gabriel River including the estuary;

WHEREAS, various MS4 Permittees desire to facilitate the achievement of the objectives of the Harbor Toxic Pollutants TMDL by installing one monitoring station in the Los Angeles River at Wardlow Road, one monitoring station in the San Gabriel River near Spring Street, and one monitoring station in the Coyote Creek, also near Spring Street and conducting monitoring at said monitoring stations (collectively "Monitoring Stations") to ensure consistency with other regional monitoring programs and usability with other TMDL related studies;

WHEREAS, installation of the Monitoring Stations and future monitoring requires administrative coordination for the various MS4 Permittees that the GWMA can and is willing to provide;

WHEREAS, the members of the GWMA are the Cities of Artesia, Avalon, Bell, Bell Gardens, Bellflower, Cerritos, Commerce, Cudahy, Downey, Hawaiian Gardens, Huntington Park, La Mirada, Lakewood, Long Beach, Lynwood, Maywood, Montebello, Norwalk, Paramount, Pico Rivera, Santa Fe Springs, Signal Hill, South Gate, Vernon, Whittier, Water Replenishment District, Central Basin Municipal Water District and the Long Beach Water Department ("GWMA Members");

WHEREAS, because of the financial savings and benefits resulting from this cost-sharing arrangement, other MS4 Permittees that are not GWMA Members may request to participate in the cost sharing of the Monitoring Costs for the installation of the Monitoring Stations and the costs of monitoring conducted at the Monitoring Stations (collectively "Monitoring Costs");

WHEREAS, the GWMA Board of Directors authorized the GWMA to enter into individual separate agreements with such individual MS4 Permittees (which shall not have voting rights in any group relating to the GWMA Members) for purposes of only cost sharing in the Monitoring Costs;

WHEREAS, because GWMA Members already pay annual membership fees that pay for GWMA administrative costs, GWMA Members that participate in the cost share for the Monitoring Costs shall pay a three percent (3%) administrative fee on each payment to cover various administrative costs;

WHEREAS, MS4 Permittees that are not GWMA Members that participate in the cost share for the Monitoring Costs shall pay an eight and seventy-six hundredths percent (8.76%) administrative fee on each payment to cover various administrative costs. Five percent (5%) of such amount represents the estimated direct, actual costs of the GWMA's administrative expenses and three and seventy-six hundredths percent (3.76%) represents the estimated indirect, overhead costs of the GWMA's administrative expenses;

WHEREAS, certain private NPDES permit holders that are subject to the Harbor Toxic Pollutants TMDL have also expressed interest in participating in the cost share for the Monitoring Costs and procuring the monitoring data generated pursuant to this Agreement in order to satisfy their own permit obligations;

WHEREAS, it is currently unknown how many MS4 Permittees and private NPDES permit holders will ultimately participate in the cost sharing of the Monitoring Costs;

WHEREAS, depending on how many MS4 Permittees and private NPDES permit holders ultimately participate in the cost sharing for the Monitoring Costs, each participating Permittee's annual cost share amount will be adjusted and the GWMA will notify each participating Permittee of its adjusted annual cost share amount in writing;

WHEREAS, the Permittee desires to share in the Monitoring Costs;

WHEREAS, the Parties have determined that authorizing GWMA to hire consultants as necessary to install and maintain the Monitoring Stations and conduct the monitoring required by the Harbor Toxic Pollutants TMDL will be beneficial to the Parties;

WHEREAS, the Permittee agrees to pay: (a) its proportional share of the Monitoring Costs to be incurred by the GWMA in accordance with the Cost Sharing Formula reflected in Exhibit "A"; and (b) applicable administrative fees to cover administrative costs; and

WHEREAS, the role of the GWMA is to: (1) invoice and collect funds from the Permittee to cover its portion of the Monitoring Costs; and (2) hire and retain consultants to install Monitoring Stations and conduct monitoring at the Monitoring Stations.

- NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and conditions set forth herein, the Parties do hereby agree as follows:
- Section 1. Recitals. The recitals set forth above are fully incorporated as part of this Agreement.
- Section 2. <u>Purpose</u>. The purpose of this Agreement is for the Permittee to cost share in the Monitoring Costs.
- Section 3. <u>Cooperation</u>. The Parties shall fully cooperate with one another to achieve the purposes of this Agreement.
 - Section 4. Voluntary Nature. The Parties voluntarily enter into this Agreement.
- Section 5. <u>Binding Effect</u>. This Agreement shall become binding on GWMA and the Permittee.
- Section 6. <u>Term.</u> This Agreement shall commence on July 1, 2018 and shall expire on June 30, 2023, unless terminated earlier pursuant to this Agreement.

Section 7. Role of the GWMA.

- (a) The GWMA shall invoice and collect funds from the Permittee to cover the Monitoring Costs; and
- (b) The GWMA shall administer the consultants' contracts for the Monitoring Costs. Provided the Permittee has paid all outstanding invoices to the GWMA to cover the Monitoring Costs and administrative costs, the GWMA will provide the Permittee with the monitoring data collected from the Monitoring Stations.
- (c) At the request of an MS4 Permittee that participates in the cost sharing for the Monitoring Costs, the GWMA is authorized and may negotiate, enter into agreements with, and collect funds from general and individual NPDES permit holders

that are not MS4 Permittees for cost-sharing the Monitoring Costs.

Section 8. Financial Terms.

- (a) Initial Payment Amount. The Permittee shall pay no more than Three Thousand Three Hundred Nine Dollars and Fifty Cents (\$3,309.50) for the initial payment ("Initial Payment Amount"), for the 2018-2019 fiscal year to the GWMA for managing the installation of the Monitoring Stations and the monitoring data collected at the Monitoring Stations for the 2018-2019 fiscal year. This Initial Payment Amount includes: (1) the Permittee's cost share amount ("Cost Share Amount") identified in Exhibit "A", attached hereto and incorporated herein; and (2) the Administrative Costs Payment Amount identified in subsection (c) of this Section 8.
- (b) Annual Payment Amount. For each subsequent fiscal year, commencing with the 2019-2020 fiscal year, the Permittee shall pay no more than Three Thousand Three Hundred Nine Dollars and Fifty Cents (\$3,309.50) ("Annual Payment Amount") annually on a fiscal year (July 1st to June 30th) basis to the GWMA in exchange for the monitoring data collected from the Monitoring Stations. This Annual Payment Amount includes: (1) the Permittee's Cost Share Amount identified in Exhibit "A", attached hereto and incorporated herein; and (2) the Administrative Costs Payment Amount identified in subsection (c) of this Section 8.
- (c) Administrative Costs. As part of the Initial Payment Amount and the Annual Payment Amount, the Permittee shall also pay its proportional share of the GWMA's staff time for hiring the consultants and invoicing the Permittee, legal fees incurred by the GWMA in the performance of its duties under this Agreement, and audit expenses and other overhead costs ("Administrative Costs Payment Amount"). The Administrative Costs Payment Amount will be added to the Permittee's annual invoice to cover the Permittee's share of the administrative costs.
- i. GWMA Members. If the Permittee is a GWMA Member, then the Administrative Costs Payment Amount shall be three percent (3%) of the Permittee's Cost Share Amount identified in Exhibit "A." Beginning with the 2019-2020 fiscal year and for each fiscal year thereafter, the GWMA will evaluate this Administrative Costs Payment Amount to ensure it adequately recovers the GWMA's cost of performing its duties under this Agreement. Based on this review, the GWMA may increase or decrease the Administrative Costs Payment Amount for the next fiscal year. The GWMA will provide the Permittee thirty (30) days' written notice prior to July 1st of the fiscal year in which a new Administrative Costs Payment Amount will take effect.
- ii. Non-GWMA Members. If the Permittee is not a GWMA Member, then the GWMA shall charge eight and seventy-six hundredths percent (8.76%) of the Permittee's Cost Share Amount identified in Exhibit "A." Five percent (5%) of such amount represents the estimated direct, actual costs of the GWMA's Administrative Costs and three and seventy-six hundredths percent (3.76%) represents the estimated indirect, overhead costs of the GWMA's Administrative Costs. Beginning

with the 2019-2020 fiscal year and for each fiscal year thereafter, the GWMA will evaluate this Administrative Costs Payment Amount to ensure it adequately recovers the GWMA's cost of performing its duties under this Agreement. Based on this review, the GWMA may increase or decrease the Administrative Costs Payment Amount for the next fiscal year. The GWMA will provide the Permittee thirty (30) days' written notice prior to July 1st of the fiscal year in which a new Administrative Costs Payment Amount will take effect.

- (d) The Permittee's Initial Payment Amount shall cover the 2018-2019 fiscal year and is due upon execution of this Agreement, but in no event later than June 30, 2018. For each subsequent fiscal year, commencing with the 2019-2020 fiscal year, the GWMA shall submit annual invoices to the Permittee for the Annual Payment Amount and no later than the April 1st prior to the new fiscal year.
- (e) Adjustment of Cost Share Based on Number of Participants. The Initial Payment Amount, the Annual Payment Amount, and the Administrative Costs Payment Amount identified in this Section 8 ("Financial Terms") represent the maximum dollar amounts that the Permittee is required to submit to the GWMA, but may be reduced based on the final number of MS4 Permittees that participate in the cost sharing for the Monitoring Costs.
- Reserve Credits. If the Permittee's actual cost share amount plus (f) administrative costs are less than the Initial Payment Amount or the Annual Payment Amount, plus the Administrative Costs Payment Amount, paid by the Permittee in a particular year, then the GWMA will notify the Permittee in writing on the next available invoice and will presume that the Permittee desires any excess balance be credited toward the Permittee's Annual Payment Amount and/or Administrative Costs Payment Amount in subsequent years, less a reasonable contingency as determined by the GWMA not to exceed \$10,000. Such a credit will be applied to the Initial Payment Amount if an excess balance exists for funds paid by Permittee under a prior cost share agreement between the Parties. In lieu of a credit, the Permittee may elect to retain any excess balance as reserves for future Annual Payments Amounts and/or Administrative Costs Payment amounts, and pay the full invoiced amount to the GWMA. Notwithstanding the forgoing, the Administrative Costs Payment Amount charged to non-GWMA Members for indirect, overhead costs in the amount of three and seventysix hundredths percent (3.76%) of the Permittee's Cost Share Amount will be retained by GWMA and is not subject to a credit.
- (g) Upon receiving an invoice from the GWMA, the Permittee shall pay the invoiced amount to the GWMA within thirty (30) days of the invoice's date.
- (h) The Permittee shall be delinquent if its invoiced payment is not received by the GWMA within forty-five (45) days after the invoice's date. If the Permittee is delinquent, the GWMA will: 1) verbally contact the representative of the Permittee; and 2) submit a formal letter from the GWMA Executive Officer to the Permittee at the address listed in Section 12 of this Agreement. If payment is not received within sixty (60) days of the original invoice date, the GWMA may terminate

this Agreement. However, no such termination may be ordered unless the GWMA first provides the Permittee with thirty (30) days written notice of its intent to terminate the Agreement. The terminated Permittee shall remain obligated to GWMA for its delinquent payments and any other obligations incurred prior to the date of termination. If the GWMA terminates this Agreement because the Permittee is delinquent in its payment, the Permittee shall no longer be entitled to the monitoring data collected from the Monitoring Stations.

(i) Any delinquent payments by the Permittee shall accrue compound interest at the average rate of interest paid by the Local Agency Investment Fund during the time that the payment is delinquent.

Section 9. Independent Contractor.

- (a) The GWMA is, and shall at all times remain, a wholly independent contractor for performance of the obligations described in this Agreement. The GWMA's officers, officials, employees and agents shall at all times during the term of this Agreement be under the exclusive control of the GWMA. The Permittee cannot control the conduct of the GWMA or any of its officers, officials, employees or agents. The GWMA and its officers, officials, employees, and agents shall not be deemed to be employees of the Permittee.
- (b) The GWMA is solely responsible for the payment of salaries, wages, other compensation, employment taxes, workers' compensation, or similar taxes for its employees and consultants performing services hereunder.

Section 10. <u>Indemnification and Insurance</u>.

- (a) The Permittee shall defend, indemnify and hold harmless the GWMA and its officers, employees, and other representatives and agents from and against any and all liabilities, actions, suits proceedings, claims, demands, losses, costs, and expenses, including legal costs and attorney's fees, for injury to or death of person(s), for damage to property (including property owned by the GWMA) for negligent or intentional acts, errors and omissions committed by the Permittee or its officers, employees, and agents, arising out of or related to that Permittee's performance under this Agreement, except for such loss as may be caused by GWMA's negligence or that of its officers, employees, or other representatives and agents, excluding the consultant.
- (b) GWMA makes no guarantee or warranty that any monitoring data prepared by the consultants shall be approved by the relevant governmental authorities. GWMA shall have no liability to the Permittee for the negligent or intentional acts or omissions of GWMA's consultants.

Section 11. Termination.

(a) The Permittee may terminate this Agreement for any reason, or no reason, by giving the GWMA prior written notice thereof, but the Permittee shall remain Page 6 of 11

responsible for its entire Annual Payment Amount through the end of the current fiscal year during which Permittee terminates the Agreement and shall not be entitled any refund of any portion of said Annual Payment Amount. Moreover, unless the Permittee provides written notice of termination to the GWMA by February 15th immediately prior to the new fiscal year, the Permittee shall also be responsible for its Annual Payment Amount through the end of the new fiscal year (*e.g.*, If the Permittee terminates on March 1st, 2019, the Permittee is responsible for the Annual Payment Amounts for both FY 2018-2019 and FY 2019-2020. If the Permittee terminates on February 10, 2019, the Permittee is responsible for its Annual Payment Amount only for FY 2018-2019, not for FY 2019-2020). If the Permittee terminates the Agreement, the Permittee shall remain liable for any loss, debt, or liability otherwise incurred through the end of the new fiscal year.

(b) The GWMA may, with a vote of the GWMA Board, terminate this Agreement upon not less than thirty (30) days written notice to the Permittee. Any remaining funds not due and payable or otherwise legally committed to Consultant shall be returned to the Permittee.

Section 12. Miscellaneous.

- Other NPDES Permit Holders. Individual or general NPDES permit (a) holders who are not MS4 Permittees that receive Harbor Toxic Pollutants TMDL monitoring requirements in their NPDES permits may wish to participate in this cost share for the Monitoring Costs in order to receive the monitoring data collected from the Monitoring Stations. Upon receipt of a written request from an NPDES permit holder to participate in this cost share, the GWMA will either reject or accept the NPDES permit holder's participation in the cost share arrangement. If accepted, the NPDES permit holder will enter into a separate cost share agreement with the GWMA that will require the NPDES permit holder to pay annually twelve thousand three hundred dollars (\$12,300) ("Private Monitoring Fee") for the Monitoring Costs. Failure to pay the Private Monitoring Fee by the date set forth in the cost share agreement will result in termination of the NPDES permit holder's participant status. An NPDES permit holder accepted as a participant will only be entitled to receive the monitoring data collected from the Monitoring Stations for any fiscal year in which the participant has paid its Private Monitoring Fee. The Private Monitoring Fee will be applied as a credit toward the Permittee's Annual Payment Amount in proportion to the Permittee's Cost Share Amount identified in Exhibit "A."
- (b) <u>Notices</u>. All Notices which the Parties require or desire to give hereunder shall be in writing and shall be deemed given when delivered personally or three (3) days after mailing by registered or certified mail (return receipt requested) to the following address or as such other addresses as the Parties may from time to time designate by written notice in the aforesaid manner:

- (c) <u>Amendment</u>. The terms and provisions of this Agreement may not be amended, modified or waived, except by a written instrument signed by all Parties.
- (d) <u>Waiver</u>. Waiver by either the GWMA or the Permittee of any term, condition, or covenant of this Agreement shall not constitute a waiver of any other term, condition, or covenant. Waiver, by the GWMA or the Permittee, to any breach of the provisions of this Agreement shall not constitute a waiver of any other provision or a waiver of any subsequent breach of any provision of this Agreement.
- (e) <u>Law to Govern: Venue</u>. This Agreement shall be interpreted, construed, and governed according to the laws of the State of California. In the event of litigation between the Parties, venue shall lie exclusively in the County of Los Angeles.
- (f) <u>No Presumption in Drafting</u>. The Parties to this Agreement agree that the general rule than an agreement is to be interpreted against the Party drafting it, or causing it to be prepared, shall not apply.
- (g) <u>Severability</u>. If any term, provision, condition or covenant of this Agreement is declared or determined by any court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, void, or unenforceable, the remaining provisions of this Agreement shall not be affected thereby and this Agreement shall be read and construed without the invalid, void, or unenforceable provisions(s).
- (h) <u>Entire Agreement</u>. This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement of the Parties with respect to the subject matter hereof and supersedes all prior or contemporaneous agreements, whether written or oral, with respect thereto.
- (i) <u>Counterparts</u>. This Agreement may be executed in any number of counterparts, each of which shall be an original, but all of which taken together shall constitute but one and the same instrument, provided, however, that such counterparts shall have been delivered to all Parties to this Agreement.

- (j) <u>Legal Representation</u>. All Parties have been represented by counsel in the preparation and negotiation of this Agreement. Accordingly, this Agreement shall be construed according to its fair language.
- (k) <u>Authority to Execute this Agreement</u>. The person or persons executing this Agreement on behalf of Permittee warrants and represents that he or she has the authority to execute this Agreement on behalf of the Permittee and has the authority to bind Permittee.

SUBJECT: Agreement with G2 Construction, Inc. to Provide Purchase and Installation of

Catch Basin Inserts

INTRODUCTION

As a part of the city's compliance with the municipal storm water permit, the purchase and installation of full capture devices in 10% of the city owned catch basins located in high priority uses is required every year over a period of 10 years.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The State Water Resources Control Board (State Board) and Los Angeles Regional Water Quality Control Board (Regional Board) consider trash to be a significant pollutant in California's waters. In 2015, the State Board adopted statewide consistency in regulating trash to protect aquatic life, public health and provide other beneficial uses, and to reduce environmental issues associated with trash in State waters (known as the "Trash Amendments").

As an owner and operator of a municipal storm drain system, Lakewood is required to comply with the Trash Amendments. Citics have 10 years to demonstrate full compliance with the Trash Amendments by installing, operating and maintaining full capture systems for storm drains that capture runoff from priority land uses in their respective jurisdictions. In order to facilitate compliance, the city joined Watershed Management Programs (WMPs) in the Lower Los Angeles River Watershed, Los Cerritos Channel Watershed and the Lower San Gabriel River Watershed. Under the respective WMPs, the city made a commitment to install full capture systems on catch basins within the city.

BACKGROUND

In 2014, the County of Orange released Request for Proposals No. 080-P08019 for trash and debris capture devices (RFP). The County of Orange's evaluation committee for the RFP scored and ranked six submitted proposals in January 2015. The evaluation committee issued a recommendation that scored G2 Construction, Inc. (G2) as the top ranked proposer. The County of Orange entered into a Master Agreement with for trash and debris capture devices (MA-080-15011198), which includes a clause for cooperative agreements, extending the provisions and pricing to other California local or State government agencies wishing to procure trash and debris capture devices.

Public agencies often utilize other agencies' formal bidding results when the agreement between the agency and the vendor meets the needs of the using agency. In this case, the city would select G2 solicited as part of the Orange County's bid process and use the approved pricing to establish an agreement with the vendor to purchase and install catch basin inserts in Lakewood.

DISCUSSION

Public Works was satisfied with G2's installation of catch basin inserts in 2016. The proposed scope of work will consist of the purchase and installation of full capture catch basins inserts in City-owned catch basins. G2 will be providing all of the services and materials necessary for the installation of the catch basin insert in all locations, including traffic control. Staff is focusing on high priority land use areas with city-owned catch basins and in the future will need to purchase and install inserts in County-owned catch basins located with Lakewood.

FISCAL IMPACT

The installation cost of the inserts in City-owned catch basins is budgeted in the Public Works Capital Improvement Budget in an amount not to exceed \$30,000.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that:

1. City Council approve the attached agreement with G2 Construction, Inc., authorizing the city to purchase and installation of inserts in city-owned catch basins.

AGREEMENT FOR SERVICES

BETWEEN

CITY OF LAKEWOOD AND G2 CONSTRUCTION, INC.

THIS AGREEMENT, made and entered into this 22ND day of MAY, 2018, by and between CITY OF LAKEWOOD, a municipal corporation, sometimes hereinafter referred to as CITY, and G2 CONSTRUCTION, INC, sometimes hereinafter referred to as SERVICE PROVIDER,

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, CITY is in need of the services of a trash and debris capture equipment manufacturer and installation company, and said G2 CONSTRUCTION, INC is desirous of providing said services;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing recitals, the parties hereto do mutually agree as follows:

1. <u>Scope of Services</u>.

SERVICE PROVIDER agrees to provide to CITY at its own cost and expense when requested by CITY those services set forth on Exhibit A attached hereto and made a part hereof.

2. <u>Compensation for Services.</u>

CITY agrees to pay SERVICE PROVIDER for all services rendered under the Scope of Services. Said compensation shall be as billed in accordance with the fee schedule included in Exhibit A, attached. SERVICE PROVIDER shall submit invoices to the Director of Public Works for approval prior to authorization of payment. The total compensation under this Agreement shall not exceed \$30,000.

Payments on approved invoices shall be made within thirty (30) days of receipt and approval of said invoice by the Director of Public Works.

In the event the not-to-exceed amount of this Agreement must be exceeded for any reason, the City Manager shall be authorized to approve amendments up to ten percent (10%) of the Agreement amount OR \$9,999.00, whichever is the <u>lesser</u> amount, for each amendment.

3. Independent Contractor.

It is expressly understood and agreed that SERVICE PROVIDER has been retained, at its request, as an independent contractor, as distinguished from an employee or agent of CITY to perform the aforementioned services. SERVICE PROVIDER acknowledges the independent contractor relationship and releases CITY from any liability or obligation to make deductions or withholding from his compensation in respect to unemployment, income taxes, disability, social security, health or pension matters.

SERVICE PROVIDER acknowledges his independent contractor's status in performing said services, and agrees to bear the risk of property damage or loss to any property arising out of the work site, the place to work, or the duties bestowed upon SERVICE PROVIDER pursuant to this Agreement, and does hereby release CITY, its officers and personnel from any liability to SERVICE PROVIDER for any loss or damage thereby incurred, except where said loss or damage was caused by CITY.

In the performance of this agreement, SERVICE PROVIDER shall comply with all applicable provisions of the California Fair Employment Practices Act (California Labor Code Sections (410 et seq.) and the applicable equal employment provisions of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 (42 U.S.C. 200e 217), whichever is more restrictive.

4. Termination.

Either party to this Agreement may terminate the same at any time by giving the other at least thirty (30) days' written prior notice thereof. In the event of termination, CITY shall pay to SERVICE PROVIDER the total value of the services of SERVICE PROVIDER to the final date of termination computed in accordance with the terms and provisions of this Agreement.

5. Term.

This Agreement shall be for a term commencing May 22nd, 2018 and terminating JUNE 30TH, 2019 and may be renewed by CITY with the concurrence of SERVICE PROVIDER for any successive three-year term, unless sooner terminated as hereinbefore provided.

6. Assignment.

SERVICE PROVIDER shall not assign the performance of this Agreement, nor any part thereof, nor any monies due hereunder, without the prior written consent of CITY.

7. Ownership of Documents.

It is understood and agreed CITY has full and complete and absolute title to all plans, drawings, reports, and other documents supplied by CITY to SERVICE PROVIDER during the course of this Agreement, or prepared by SERVICE PROVIDER for CITY during the eourse of this Agreement.

8. Insurance.

The SERVICE PROVIDER at all times during the term of this Agreement, shall maintain and keep in full force and effect, and deposit with the City, insurance or a Certificate of Insurance which shall evidence the faet that the SERVICE PROVIDER has in full force and effect a comprehensive personal injury and property damage policy proteeting the SERVICE PROVIDER and the City from liability in the following policies of insurance with minimum limits as indicated below and issued by insurers with A.M. Best ratings of no less than A-: VI:

- Commercial general liability at least as broad as ISO CG 0001 (per occurrence) \$1,000,000; (general aggregate) \$2,000,000
- Commercial auto liability at least as broad as ISO CA 0001 (per accident) \$1,000,000

Said policy shall contain a provision that the same cannot be canceled without at least thirty (30) days notice to the City thereof and shall name the City as an additional insured.

• Worker's compensation- Statutory

SERVICE PROVIDER certifies that it is aware of the provisions of the Labor Code of the State of California, which require every employer to be insured against liability for workers compensation or to undertake self-insurance in accordance with the provisions of that eode, and it certified that it will comply with such provisions before commencing the performance of the work of this Agreement.

9. Indemnity.

SERVICE PROVIDER shall indemnify and save CITY, its officers and employees, harmless from any suits, elaims or actions brought by any person or persons, including his agents or employees, for or on account of any injuries or damages or other loss, cost or expense caused by the negligent or wrongful act or omission of SERVICE PROVIDER, his agents and employees, or his subcontractors and the agents and employees thereof, arising out of the services to be performed by SERVICE PROVIDER pursuant to this Agreement.

10. <u>Assumption of Risk</u>.

SERVICE PROVIDER does hereby assume all risks to himself, his personnel, subcontractors and agents, and any employees thereof, of personal injury or death, and all risk of property damage or loss to any property, wares, vehicles, or materials owned or possessed by SERVICE PROVIDER and said SERVICE PROVIDER further releases CITY, its officers and employees, from any liability therefor.

11. Prevailing Rate of Wages.

The Director of Public Works at the direction of CITY Council has obtained from the Department of Industrial Relations, State of California, the prevailing rate of per diem wage, and the general prevailing rate for holiday and overtime work in the locality in which this work is to be performed for each craft, classification or type or workmen needed to earry out this agreement.

In that regard, pursuant to Section 1773 of the Labor Code, holidays, upon which such rate shall be paid, need not be specified in this agreement, but shall be all holidays recognized in the eollective bargaining agreement applicable to the particular craft, classification or type or workmen employed on the project. Copies of the prevailing rate of per diem wages are on file at the Public Works office, City Hall, and are available to any interested party on request. Referenced hereto and made a part hereof as though set forth in full are rates applicable to this project and contract, and the contractor shall pay not less than the minimum thereof.

12. Reservation of Rights.

Nothing in this Agreement shall be deemed to bind CITY to any course of eonduct other than its obligation hereunder to pay SERVICE PROVIDER for said services rendered. It is understood CITY reserves complete right within its discretion to reject all or any part of any design, plan, specification or recommendation made to it, or submitted by said SERVICE PROVIDER. It is further understood that acceptance herein by CITY of any design, plan, specification or recommendation of SERVICE PROVIDER shall be for the purpose of compensating SERVICE PROVIDER only, and shall not be binding on CITY as to any other further course of action. CITY reserves the complete right to authorize additional, other or independent SERVICE PROVIDER services or studies, and it is agreed that SERVICE PROVIDER does not have any exclusive rights to said services from CITY.

13. Notice.

Any notice required to be given hereunder shall be deemed to have been given by depositing said notice in the United States mail in an envelope with postage prepaid thereon, addressed as follows:

14. <u>Safety Program.</u>

SERVICE PROVIDER shall be solely responsible for the safety of his employees. SERVICE PROVIDER shall develop and maintain an Injury and Illness Protection Program

(IIPP) in accordance with the Cal/OSHA requirements contained in the California Code of Regulations, Title 8 Section 3203 (CCR T8 Section 3203), "Injury and Illness Prevention Program." SERVICE PROVIDER shall provide safety, health, and job skills training so as to provide a safe and healthful workplace, and meet all applicable Cal/OSHA requirements. SERVICE PROVIDER shall maintain all OSHA 300 logs and records, and make them available for inspection upon request by the City.

SUBJECT: Amending the Rate for Bin and Special Refuse Services

INTRODUCTION

The contract for bin and special refuse collection and disposal services provides for an adjusted increase of 4.0 percent, based on the April-to-April CPI, to the amounts collected by the contract service provider for special bin service. The 4.0 percent is the maximum bin and special refuse rates are allowed to increase, the contract service provider may charge less, and will become effective July 1, 2018.

AB 1826, the State's New Mandatory Organics Recycling Law requires all commercial businesses and multi-family properties with five (5) or more units to arrange for recycling for specified organic waste (i.c. food and green waste). The rates for this new service is included in Appendix A.

Attached is the resolution, which implements these adjustments as listed in Appendix A.

The Environmental Management Committee is scheduled to meet on Monday evening, May 22, 2018. Staff will advise the Council on Tuesday, if the Committee has any changes to staff's recommendation.

WHEREAS, the City of Lakewood (the "City") and B-Z Disposal company (the "Contractor") did, on February 26, 2002, and on July 1, 2009 enter into an agreement for refuse collection; and

WHEREAS, the Agreement provides for an escalation rate to said maximum cap commencing July 1, 2009, and each fiscal year thereafter commencing on July I, based on the April-to-April C.P.I. (Consumer Price Index), to be prepared by the Director of Administrative Services; and

WHEREAS, on June 10, 2003, the City Council approved the assignment of the Agreement for Solid Waste Collection from B-Z Disposal Services, Inc., to EDCO Waste Services, LLC, effective July 1, 2003.

NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Lakewood does hereby resolve as follows:

SECTION 1. The Director of Administrative Services finds that the escalation rate is 4.000 percent.

SECTION 2. The fees or charges for bin and special service set forth in Appendix A, attached hereto, have been adjusted by the Director of Administrative Services based on the escalation rate. Said adjusted fees or charges shall be effective on July I, 2018, and shall be the maximum fees or charges collected by the Contractor for special bin service.

SECTION 3. The City Clerk shall eertify to the adoption of this Resolution, and the same shall be effective as of the 1st day of July, 2018.

SUBJECT: Adoption of Resolution No. 2018-22: Amending Resolution 2008-21 to Establish

Additional Charges for Violations Relating to the Possession or Use of Illegal

Fireworks

INTRODUCTION

For over 10 years, the City has levied a fine of up to \$1,000 for the possession or use of illegal fireworks, such as skyrockets, firecrackers and other explosives. Fireworks are illegal in Lakewood unless they carry the "safe and sane" seal of approval from the state Fire Marshal. Such "safe and sane" fireworks do not explode or launch into the air. It is the opinion of many residents, City staff and Council Members that the possession and use of illegal and dangerous fireworks has increased in recent years. For that reason, the Council's Public Safety Committee has held several meetings with the issue of illegal fireworks use on its agenda. The Committee has directed staff to present the Council with a plan for increasing the financial penalty for the possession or use of illegal fireworks, in combination with a plan to enhance the City's public education efforts to dissuade residents from their possession and use. This proposed resolution fulfills one part of that recommended package of actions.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

The City's fine for the possession or use of illegal fireworks has not increased for at least 10 years, such that, through inflation, the deterrent value of that fine has diminished. State law limits the ceiling of the fine to \$1,000; however, state law does not limit a city's ability to collect from the violator additional costs that the city incurs such as: (a) the state Fire Marshal's illegal fireworks disposal fee of \$250, (b) a late fee in the amount of \$250, in the event that the base fine and any additional charges are not paid in full within 30 days, (c) all costs incurred in collecting the fine and additional charges, including but not limited to administrative costs, collection fees, attorneys' fees and court costs. These additional charges could total over \$1,000, which, combined with the base fine of \$1,000, could bring the total cost to over \$2,000 to a violator of the City's illegal fireworks resolution.

At the recommendation of the Council's Public Safety Committee, this increase in penalties and charges for illegal fireworks possession and use would be combined with a vigorous public education campaign that would include new graphics and written materials warning residents about the dangers of illegal fireworks use. The City will once again hire extra Sheriff's Deputies this July 4th to have a strong presence in the community and to respond as quickly as possible to reports of illegal fireworks use. The City will also institute a program of writing in advance to past illegal fireworks violators

indicating that their address will be provided to the Sheriff's Department so that Deputies can drive by their address on July 4th to ensure that illegal fireworks are not in use.

Lakewood is not alone among communities that experience the dangerous use of illegal fireworks on July 4th. Communities experience the problem whether or not they allow the sale of safe and sane fireworks. But the Public Safety Committee has recommended that staff and the City take new and enhanced steps to do everything possible to reduce the problem in Lakewood.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

That the City Council adopt the attached resolution, which establishes additional charges for violations relating to the possession or use of illegal fireworks.

RESOLUTION NO. 2018-22

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LAKEWOOD AMENDING RESOLUTION NO. 2008-21 TO ESTABLISH ADDITIONAL CHARGES FOR VIOLATIONS RELATING TO THE POSSESSION OR USE OF ILLEGAL FIREWORKS.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LAKEWOOD DOES RESOLVE AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION I. Resolution No. 2008-21 is hereby amended to establish the following additional charges for violations relating to the possession or use of illegal fireworks: (a) An amount equal to 25% of the fine assessed, to he held in trust to pay for the cost of handling of such illegal fireworks by the California State Fire Marshal; (b) a late fee in the amount of 25% of the fine assessed, in the event that such fine and the additional amount set forth in (a), above, are not paid in full within 30 days after the issuance of the Administrative Citation; and (c) all costs incurred in collecting the fine plus the additional charges set forth in (a) and (b), above, including but not limited to administrative costs, collection fees, attorneys' fees, and court costs.

SECTION 2. Except as amended herein, Resolution No. 2008-21 shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 3. If any section, subsection, subdivision, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase in this Resolution, or any part hereof, is held invalid or unconstitutional, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining sections or portions of this Resolution. The City Council hereby declares that it would have adopted each section, subsection, subdivision, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase in this Resolution irrespective of the fact that any one or more sections, subsections, subdivisions, paragraphs, sentences, clauses or phrases may be deelared invalid or unconstitutional.

SECTION 4. The City Clerk shall eertify to the adoption of this Resolution.

SUBJECT: Quarterly Schedule of Investments

INTRODUCTION

The investments represented in this report are allocated to a variety of funds such as the General Fund, Water Fund, Redevelopment Funds, Restricted Special Revenue Funds, and Fiduciary Funds.

The City's idle funds are invested in compliance with the City's investment policy, which was last reviewed and approved in January 2018 by the City Council, and in compliance with the updated Investment Policy. Specifically, the city's investment objectives are safety, liquidity and yield. To accomplish these objectives, the following types of investments have been selected and the City is currently or in the past invested in the following securities:

Treasury Notes

TREAS Obligations of the U.S. Government to provide for the eash flow needs of the Federal Government.

Federal Agency Bonds or Notes:

Federal agency or United States government-sponsored enterprise obligations, participations, or other instruments, including those issued by or fully guaranteed as to principal and interest by federal agencies or United States government-sponsored enterprises.

- FHLB (Federal Home Loan Bank Bonds)
 Bonds and discount notes issued by the Federal Home Loan Bank to provide funding to member institutions and make available money to the residential mortgage market.
- FHLMC (Federal Home Loan Mortgage Corp)

 A publiely ehartered agency that buys qualifying residential mortgages from lenders, packages them into new securities backed by those pooled mortgages, provides certain guarantees and then re-sells the securities on the open market.
- FNMA (Federal National Mortgage Association)
 National Mortgage Association is a government-sponsored, privately owned corporation established to create a secondary market for Federal Housing Administration mortgages.
- FFCB (Federal Farm Credit Bank)
 The Federal Farm Credit Bank is an independent agency of the U.S. Government which issues bonds and discount notes to provide short- and long-term eredit and eredit-related services to farmers, ranchers, rural homeowners, producers and harvesters.

Snpra-National Agency Bonds or Notes

Supranational bonds and notes are debt of international or multi-lateral financial agencies. The debt is used to finance economic/infrastructure development, environmental protection, poverty reduction and renewable energy around the globe, rated AAA, highly liquid and issued in a range of maturities.

Negotiable Certificates of Deposit

Negotiable CDs are issued by large banks and are freely traded in secondary markets as short term (2 to 52 weeks), large denomination (\$100,000 minimum) CD, that are either issued at a discount on its par value, or at a fixed interest rate payable at maturity.

Muuieipal Bonds or Notes:

Registered treasury notes or bonds issued by states or municipalities, including bonds payable solely out of the revenues from a revenue-producing property owned, controlled, or operated by a state or by a department, board, agency, or authority of any of the other 49 United States, in addition to California.

Corporate Notes:

Medium-term notes, defined as all corporate and depository institution debt securities with a maximum remaining maturity of five years of less, issued by corporations organized and operating within the Unites States or by depository institutions licensed by the United States, or any state and operating within the United States. Medium-term corporate notes shall be rated in a rating category of "A" or its equivalent or better.

Commercial Paper:

Commercial paper of "prime" quality of the highest ranking or of the highest letter and number rating as provided for by a nationally recognized statistical-rating organization.

Pooled Fuuds:

LAIF (Local Agency Investment Fund, State of California)

This investment pool is administered by the Treasurer of the State of California, and provides a high-level of liquidity and strong safety through diversification of investments.

CAMP (California Asset Management Program)

A Joint Powers Authority established in 1989 by the treasurers and finance directors of several California public agencies to provide professional investment services at a reasonable cost. Participation is limited to California public agencies.

Los Angeles County Pool

Investment in the Los Angeles County Pool may not exceed the current pool limits and should be reviewed periodically.

MMKT (Money Market)

This is a money market interest-bearing checking account that is fully insured and collateralized.
