SUBJECT: Fund Exchange and Assignment Agreement

INTRODUCTION

City of Lakewood has uncommitted funding authority for its allocations of Proposition A Local Return funds which could be made available to the City of West Hollywood to support that city's community shuttle and demand-response services to serve people with disabilities and the general public, and to reduce congestion and parking problems of the City. Due to the limited amount of Local Return allocation provided to the City of West Hollywood, and the needs of other priority transit projects in the City, the City of West Hollywood has inadequate Proposition A Local Return funding for these services.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

The City of Lakewood has previously exchanged Proposition A Transit Funds with West Hollywood as well as the cities of Manhattan Beach, Commerce and Santa Fe Springs.

The City of West Hollywood is requesting an exchange of \$800,000.00 of the City of Lakewood's Proposition A funds for which the City of Lakewood would receive seventy cents on the dollar (\$.70 per dollar) equivalent to \$560,000.00 in General Funds. If approved, the transfer will be accomplished by the City of Lakewood writing a check to the City of West Hollywood in the amount of \$800,000.00 from available Prop A funds. and the City of West Hollywood will write a check to the City of Lakewood in the amount of \$560,000.00 from available general funds

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the City Council approve the Proposition A Transit Fund Exchange and Assignment Agreement with the City of West Hollywood, and authorize the City Manager and Director of Administrative Services to execute the Agreement.

SUBJECT: Community Safety Commission Recommendation - Disabled Person Parking

INTRODUCTION

The Community Safety Commission met on February 4, 2013, to consider various community safety matters that included the consideration of a request for disabled person parking at 5602 Rocket Street.

STATEMENT OF FACT

A request for disabled person parking was received from the tenant of 5602 Rocket Street stating that he does not drive, lives in a duplex, and next door to a restaurant. His daughter lives with him and provides full time care. She prefers to help him access her vehicle at the curb since the driveway is shared by another duplex. Street parking is limited due to tenants, restaurant employees, and customers using the street for overflow parking.

Staff verified the placard for this address and visited the site to find the requestor lives in the rear unit of a duplex and next to Joe's Sushi Restaurant. Two separate duplexes share a common driveway with garages at the rear each property. Staff monitored the site to find street parking was limited and vehicles were parked on the driveway. The requestor is aware that anyone in possession of a disabled person parking placard would be able to park in the requested restricted area. The location is shown on the attached map.

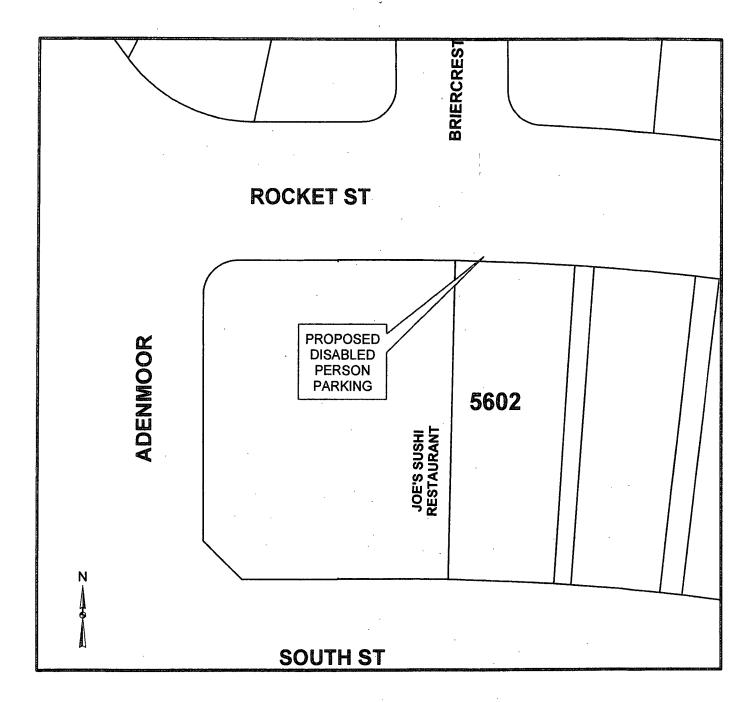
RECOMMENDATION

RESOLUTION NO. 2012-73

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LAKEWOOD ESTABLISHING DISABLED PERSON DESIGNATED PARKING ON THE SOUTH SIDE OF ROCKET STREET WITHIN THE CITY OF LAKEWOOD

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LAKEWOOD DOES RESOLVE AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. This Resolution is enacted pursuant to Section 21458 and 22507 of the Vehicle Code of the State of California, and Section 3250.2 of the Lakewood Municipal Code.

SECTION 2. Disabled person designated parking is hereby established on the south side of Rocket Street, beginning one hundred fifty-seven (157) feet east of the easterly curb line of Adenmoor Avenue, continuing easterly for a distance of (20) feet within the City of Lakewood. No vehicle shall stop, stand or park in said parking restriction unless displaying a special identification license plate or placard issued by the Department of Motor Vehicles pursuant to Section 22511.55 of the California Vehicle Code.

SECTION 3. This resolution shall be effective as long as said restriction is painted and posted in accordance with the requirements of Vehicle Code Section 22511.7 of the California Vehicle Code. In addition, this resolution shall be in effect only as long as Mitchell Wayne Snyder, a physically disabled person, occupies the unit at 5602 Rocket Street.

SECTION 4. This resolution has been adopted pursuant to a Community Safety Commission recommendation.

SUBJECT: Water Well #22 Relining Project

INTRODUCTION

Water Well #22, located adjacent to Plant #22 on Candlewood St. and Downey Ave., was drilled in 1996. The well is equipped with a variable frequency drive, which allows the well to pump into the reservoir or directly into the water distribution system. This feature, however, cannot be utilized due to taste and odor issues. A treatment process is necessary to improve water quality and allow this well to operate without the adjacent reservoir. In October 2010, the City Council approved an engineering services agreement for the design work associated with the installation of a treatment plant to eliminate these water quality problems. Initial design work indicated the need for additional construction work on the well to optimize production, design the appropriate treatment process and size the treatment plant to meet the well's production capacity.

STATEMENT OF FACT

In an effort to determine the capacity for the proposed treatment plant at Well #22, the consultant conducted an insitu inspection and water quality sampling from various depths of the well while running at various flow rates. The findings indicated that larger than normal amounts of sand are entering the well casing at all three levels of perforations. This sand would be detrimental to any treatment process employed.

Tetra Tech recommended that the City install a liner and gravel pack. The project also included closing those perforations in the well casing producing poor water quality. The insertion of a well liner into the existing casing reduced the well's capacity from 1,400 gpm to 1,200 gpm, but eliminated the sand extracted from the well. The total project cost: \$221,000.

After the well was placed back in service, the staff conducted additional water quality testing for analysis to determine the type of treatment necessary to eliminate the taste and odor issue that remain. The consultant is currently studying this data. While the treatment process has not be determined, it will not be the complex treatment process associated with Well #27. Project plans and specifications are expected to be ready for bid this summer, and construction to begin in FY2014.

SUMMARY

The installation of the treatment process at Well #22 to remove taste and odor issues is necessary in order to operate the well during the construction of the future reservoir replacement at this location. The treatment plant will eliminate the need to move the water through the reservoir, which provides contact time with chlorine to manage the well's water quality issues and served as a detention basin for sand produced by the well. This rehab work optimized the well's pumping capacity and will allow the proposed treatment plant to operate efficiently.
