#### INTRODUCTION

Tonight's study session will consider several items that have been worked through various Council Committees.

#### **Block Party Consideration**

After hearing a presentation on the plans for next year's Block Party at the October 30 meeting of the Community Promotions Committee, the Committee recommended that the City Council consider not holding a Block Party in 2019 due to budget constraints. It was suggested that the city could then gauge responses from residents to determine what if anything should be done in future years.

#### **Centre Pillars and other Decorative Fixtures**

The Pillars of Community art piece has fallen into a deteriorated condition, due to its unexpected poor tolerance of the exterior environment. It, along with the defunct urban stream, have reached a critical point. They represent an aesthetic eyesore and, in the case of the urban stream, an attractive nuisance of sorts. In August, staff presented the CIP Committee ideas for relocating the Pillars to the lobby of The Centre and demolishing the urban stream and restoring it to a flat, usable surface. Rather than relocating the pillar structures into The Centre, the CIP Committee recommended creating an art piece that would be similar to the tree artwork in the council offices lobby, and develop a Pillars of Community replacement on a wall within The Centre lobby.

#### **Rynerson Park Picnic Shelters**

On October 23, the City Council awarded the contract for the last segment of the park improvement project, which included installing the new restroom and connecting it and the other restroom to the newly installed sewer line. It also includes making certain ADA improvements to the parking and pedestrian bridge. Bid alternates were sought in the bidding process to gauge the cost of dealing with the two aging and unusable picnic shelters. However, due to the costs of the original scope increasing such that \$159,000 of additional funds were needed to supplement the project's budget, the replacement of the picnic shelters was not included in the award of contract.

At the Park and Development Committee on October 22, members discussed options related to the picnic shelters. Option included replacing the two shelters as a new stand-alone project, which

would cost between \$300,000 to \$400,000; or developing a "lesser" treatment that might include just picnic benches, but not shade covering, which (although an estimate was not known) would be a less expensive option. The Committee recommended that the city not replace the shelters at this point with either shelters nor the lesser treatment.

#### RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the City Council give direction relative to the various Committees' recommendations.

#### **SUBJECT**: Report of City Council Committees' Activities

#### INTRODUCTION

A brief update is provided for City Council review on the activities of the following standing committees: Community Promotions Committee, and the Budget Advisory Group.

#### STATEMENT OF FACT

#### On Monday, October 30, 2018, the Community Promotions Committee met and discussed:

#### **Tree Lighting Final Plan**

The Tree Lighting event is scheduled for December 7, 2018. Staff proposed items below for continuing to improve attendee experience:

- Continue the use of the rear City Hall parking lot for food trucks and eating areas. This year's plan is to reduce the food trucks from 14 to 12 and limit them to just the east inside curb of the parking lot, using the extra space in the north end to increase the number of tables and chairs across the dining area and better arrange the sponsor booths in that area.
- Continue the use of audio speakers in the rear parking area to air and stage the program and music.
- Due to the popularity of the game booths and the long lines in which they create, it's recommended to relocate three or more of the photo backdrops from the front City Hall area, to the rear lot, which would allow for more space for the game booth area in the front lot.
- Move the sleigh that was previously placed by the rear entrance of City Hall to a more prominent position.
- Increase the number of tables and chairs across the dining area, and better arrange the sponsor booths in the area.
- Rent an additional sleigh for \$500, as was done last year.
- Provide a Public Safety booth to promote Neighborhood Watch and other safety initiatives.
- Use the gravel lot again for extra parking. Parking staff will work the lot. Generatorpowered lights will be used to provide greater visibility.
- Retain the same hours as last year, with the event starting at 4:30 p.m. and program time on stage remaining at 6:30 p.m.

The Committee members approved staff's recommended changes.

#### 65<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Plans

Staff Member Grady stated that the city's 65<sup>th</sup> Anniversary will occur in 2019. He noted key dates being the anniversary of the cityhood vote on March 9 and the legal incorporation date on April 16. He talked about ways to celebrate the anniversary over a limited time span and piggybacking on existing events to accomplish that in a low-key and cost-conscious way for the non-major-milestone year (e.g. 50<sup>th</sup>, 75<sup>th</sup>, 100<sup>th</sup>).

Staff proposed elements of the anniversary as follows:

- Add a subtle 65<sup>th</sup> flair or banner to run across the city's logo for 2019. This could be included on the masthead of letterhead, publications and other material.
- Woody the Tree to be the official mascot of the anniversary and play a leading role in several fun activities such as:
  - ✓ Kick off the anniversary at the State of the City luncheon in February
  - $\checkmark$  Attend the mayoral transition in March
  - ✓ Appear all over the city on incorporation day, April 16
  - ✓ Visit Lakewood Center's Kids Club event in the spring
  - ✓ Print baseball trading cards of Woody throughout the decades

The Committee approved staff's proposed elements of the city's 65<sup>th</sup> Anniversary.

#### **Block Party Plans**

City Manager McCormack talked about the history of the Block Party and how its population at its inception at Lakewood's 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of incorporation prompted continuation of the event for 15 years now. He went over the several components of the event and the cost involved in past years and pointed out the continued growth of the event each year. He indicated that the adopted budget included cuts to the scope of the event that included eliminating the fireworks and not closing off Clark Avenue. He also indicated that the feedback he received from the City Council was to endeavor to retain the fireworks, but seek cost savings elsewhere. It was reported that retaining the fireworks necessarily increases the size of the event making it difficult to realize cost savings without eliminating other elements of the event. Staff was able, however, to develop a plan that doesn't involve closing off Clark Avenue, which would result in a savings of \$23K, but that the event's overall cost (less the \$23K) is essentially the same as last year.

Staff gave a slide presentation of previous years block parties and its growth over the years and talked about staff's work to prepare for the event. Staff proposed to move it to the Lakewood Center Mall. In doing that however, the city would lose some of the amenities that it has had for the event such as staging and a place for employees to take a break, which the city would have to rent tents for. With that new expense, the overall the move would only save the city approximately \$20K. It was confirmed for the Committee that the cost for the Block Party would be \$100K.

Chairperson Piazza suggested that the city not have a Block Party in 2019 and gauge responses from residents to determine what if anything should be done in future years. The Committee approved staff to recommend to the City Council, the consideration of eliminating the Civic Center Block Party for 2019 and gauge response due to not having it.

#### Holiday Ornament Proposal

City Manager McCormack stated that Lakewood Education Foundation (LEF) has asked for the Committee to consider to allow LEF to use the city's logo on holiday ornaments in which they plan to sell to make money for their organization. He then gave a policy statement suggestion as follows:

"Logo may be used as a graphic applied to materials used for fundraising only by non-profit organizations that work in Lakewood on city co-sponsored projects. Request to use the city logo and seal for such purposes must be approved in advance by the City Manager."

City Manager McCormack gave a list of non-profit organizations in Lakewood that could be included as follows:

Lakewood Education Foundation (LEF) Meals on Wheels (MOW) Project Shepherd Soroptimists Rotary Chamber of Commerce Friends of the Lakewood Library (FOLL)

Following Committee discussion and without objection, it was decided among the Committee to allow Lakewood Education Foundation (LEF) to use the city's logo on the holiday ornaments as they requested with the understanding of the following:

- LEF will include their logo on the ornament as well
- LEF will incur all cost of their items
- Use of the city's logo is for this one time use as a trial

#### On November 12, 2018, the Budget Advisory Group met and discussed:

This was the inaugural meeting of the Budget Advisory Group. At this meeting, the group of community stakeholders was given an in-depth look at the city's fiscal condition, for the purpose of gaining buy-in to the seriousness of the structural deficit. The role of the group members was explained. An overview and explanation of each of the following issues was provided to the group:

- City's Fiscal Structure
- Revenue Sources and Trends
- Cost of Doing Business
- Infrastructure Needs

It was reported that, although the city adopted a balanced budget, the city has a "structural deficit," which is when "built-in," relied upon revenue streams (e.g., sales tax) are not keeping pace with the cost of "built-in," non-discretionary things (e.g. labor) that make up the cost of doing business. The two main driving factors causing the structural deficit are the loss of sales tax due to the growth in online sales at the expense of in-person sales at "brick and mortar" stores in Lakewood; and rapidly increasing personnel costs, which are mostly attributable to increasing retirement costs stemming from decisions that State officials made 15 to 20 years ago and the more recent actions necessitated to manage the overall Statewide retirement system. It was emphasized that the structural deficit did not present an imminent fiscal crisis, but will require strategic, corrective action over the next couple of years in order to avoid potentially more severe budget modifications in the future.

The group gained a better understanding of the city's fiscal understanding and will meet again in December for the second of four total meetings of the group.

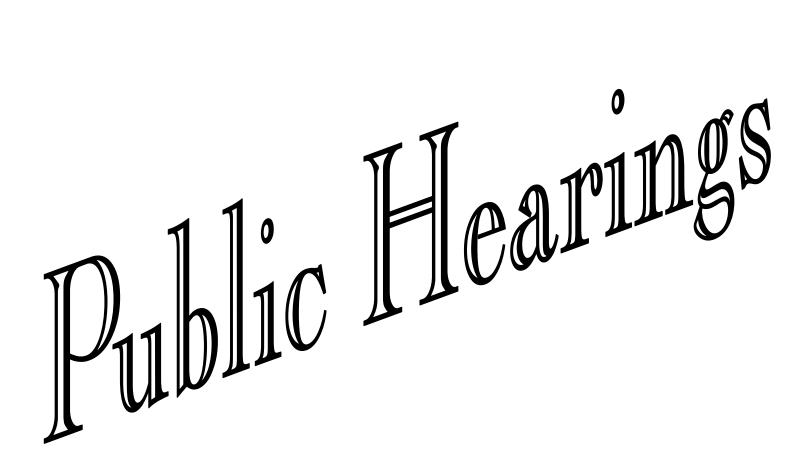

**SUBJECT:** Proposed ordinance regarding minor modifications to existing regulations

#### INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this Ordinance is to clarify the intent and implementation of some existing regulations and remove outdated provisions within the Lakewood Municipal Code (LMC) with some minor modifications to the existing provisions. This ordinance will do the following:

- 1. Creates parallel provisions in both the R-1 and M-F-R zone districts to allow churches, to have accessory fund raising activities, including bingo operations. Currently these are allowed only in the R-1 zone and this corrects an oversight in the code
- 2. Establishes the maximum hours allowed for the operation of commercial carwashes.
- 3. Clarifies that clients under the age of 18 shall be accompanied by a parent or legal guardian in order to receive massage therapy for ailments such as sports injuries.
- 4. Deletes outdated references to the R-3 and R-4 zones.

#### CEQA

The proposed ordinance is exempt from CEQA pursuant to CEQA Guidelines Section 15061(b)(3), which is the general rule that CEQA applies only to projects which have the potential for causing a significant effect on the environment and CEQA does not apply where it can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the activity may have a significant effect on the environment. This ordinance has no impact on the physical environment as it will only modify administrative procedures and not result in any changes to the physical environment.

#### PUBLIC NOTICE

Pursuant to Section 9422 of the Lakewood Municipal Code and State Law, notice of the public hearing for this amendment was posted on the City's webpage on October 19, 2018 posted in three public places on and published in the Press Telegram on October 21, 2018 pursuant to Section 9422, et seq., of the Lakewood Municipal Code and State Law.

#### RECOMMENDATION

On November 1, 2018, the Planning and Environment Commission adopted Resolution 32-2018 recommending that the City Council adopt the proposed ordinance. Staff recommends that the City Council introduce the proposed ordinance pertaining to minor modifications of existing ordinances amending the Lakewood Municipal Code to allow churches and schools in the M-F-R zone to have the same fund raising opportunities as those in the R-1 zone, establish hours of operation for carwashes, clarify that non-adult massage therapy clients shall be accompanied by a parent or legal guardian and to remove outdated references to the R-3 and R-4 zone districts, along with the related Categorical Exemption.

#### A RESOLUTION OF THE PLANNING AND ENVIRONMENT COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF LAKEWOOD RECOMMENDING TO THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LAKEWOOD APPROVAL OF A PROPOSED ORDINANCE REGARDING MINOR MODIFICATONS TO EXISTING REGULATIONS.

# THE PLANNING AND ENVIRONMENT COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF LAKEWOOD DOES HEREBY FIND, RESOLVE, AND DETERMINE AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. The Planning and Environment Commission ("Commission") conducted on the 1<sup>st</sup> day of November, 2018, a public hearing in the City Council Chambers, 5000 Clark Avenue, Lakewood, California, following proper notice of the hearing as to the time and manner as required by law. The public hearing considered an ordinance proposing to amend the Lakewood Municipal Code to make minor modifications and clarifications to some existing regulations, regarding church fund raising, hours of operations for commercial car washes, deleting out dated references to the R-3 and R-4 zones and allowing massage therapy for underage clients only when accompanied by and in the presence of a parent or legal guardian.

The Commission hereby submits its report, findings and recommendation to the City Council regarding this ordinance. A summary of the hearing is set forth in the Minutes of the Planning and Environment Commission, attached hereto and made a part hereof. The Secretary of the Commission is directed to attach the Minutes of the hearing to the Resolution when prepared and forward those to the City Council for review and consideration, whether or not first approved by the Planning and Environment Commission.

SECTION 2. This ordinance is exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to CEQA Guidelines Section 15061(b)(3) which is the general rule that CEQA applies only to projects which have the potential for causing a significant effect on the environment. CEQA does not apply where there is no possibility that the activity may have a significant effect on the environment. This ordinance has no impact on the physical environment as it will only modify administrative procedures.

SECTION 3. The Planning and Environment Commission finds that the Lakewood Municipal Code of the City of Lakewood should be amended for the following reasons and findings:

A. The public health, safety and general welfare of the City and its residents necessitates and requires the adoption of this zoning ordinance. The ordinance is needed to clarify local requirements and to maintain the character and life-style of the City.

B. This ordinance adequately addresses concerns that have been expressed in public hearings.

C. That the Planning and Environment Commission held a duly noticed public hearing on November 1, 2018 at which time it considered all evidence presented, both written and oral and at the end of the hearing voted to adopt a resolution recommending that the City Council adopt this ordinance.

SECTION 4. Based on the aforementioned findings, the Planning and Environment Commission recommends to the City Council that the City Council prepare and adopt after holding a public hearing as required by law, the attached ordinance.

#### ORDINANCE NO. 2018-9

#### AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LAKEWOOD AMENDING THE LAKEWOOD MUNICIPAL CODE AND THE ZONING ORDINANCE REGARDING MINOR MODIFICATONS TO EXISTING REGULATIONS.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LAKEWOOD DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. PURPOSE. The purpose of this Ordinance is to adopt minor modifications to several sections of the Lakewood Municipal Code to facilitate better implementation of some regulations. This ordinance does the following:

- a. Creates parallel provisions in both the R-1 and M-F-R zone districts to allow churches, to have accessory fund raising activities, including bingo operations.
- b. Establishes the maximum hours allowed for the operation of commercial carwashes.
- c. Clarifies that clients under the age of 18 shall be accompanied by a parent or legal guardian in order to receive massage therapy for ailments such as sports injuries.
- d. Deletes outdated references to the R-4 and R-3 zones.

SECTION 2. Section 9320.G of Part 2 M-F-R (Single-Family Residential) Zone Regulations of Chapter 3 Zoning of Article IX of the Lakewood Municipal Code is amended to read as follows:

#### 9320. USES PERMITTED.

•••

**G**. Accessory uses allowed in connection with any church, religious facility or school use, for fund raising purposes, including:

- 1. Temporary fireworks stands, where authorized by permit of the City Council pursuant to and subject to the provisions of Section 3105.1;
- 2. Bingo games, where authorized by permit issued under Article VI and subject to the terms and provisions of this Code pertaining to bingo games;
- 3. Carnivals, where authorized by permit issued pursuant to and subject to Article VI of this Code; and
- 4. Christmas tree and other holiday sales, where authorized by permit pursuant to and subject to Article VI of this Code.

SECTION 3. Section 9331. Uses Permitted of Part 3 M-F-R (Multiple Family Residential) Zone Regulations of Chapter 3 Zoning of Article IX of the Lakewood Municipal Code is amended by adding Subsection 9331.H, to read as follows:

#### 9331. USES PERMITTED.

• • •

H. Accessory uses allowed in connection with any church, religious facility or school use, for fund raising purposes, including:

- 1. Temporary fireworks stands, where authorized by permit of the City Council pursuant to and subject to the provisions of Section 3105.1;
- 2. Bingo games, where authorized by permit issued under Article VI and subject to the terms and provisions of this Code pertaining to bingo games;
- 3. Carnivals, where authorized by permit issued pursuant to and subject to Article VI of this Code; and
- 4. Christmas tree and other holiday sales, where authorized by permit pursuant to and subject to Article VI of this Code.

SECTION 4. Subsection 9350.B.13 of Part 5 C-4 (General Commercial) Zone Regulations of Chapter 3 Zoning of Article IX of the Lakewood Municipal Code regarding a Commercial Carwash, is amended to read as follows:

**B. USES PERMITTED SUBJECT TO CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT.** The following uses are permitted provided that in each instance a conditional use permit has been obtained and continues in full force and effect:

13. Commercial Carwash. Any self-service or full-service permanent facility offering hand and/or mechanical car washing, which includes detailing, waxing, and/or cleaning of vehicles. Carwash facilities may include outdoor vacuums, vacuum stations, and other outdoor equipment and activities normally associated with a carwash. Other activities and uses may co-locate with a carwash as deemed acceptable by the Planning and Environment Commission. The review of any proposed design shall consider and mitigate any identified impacts to adjacent properties, including those from noise, light, glare, vibration, parking, circulation and appropriate stacking distance for access lanes.

- (a) Any commercial carwash that was approved with a conditional use permit prior to and that was valid on the effective date of this Ordinance shall remain as a fully authorized land use. Any proposed modification to such a previously approved carwash shall be subject to the provisions listed in Subsection 9347.D.11.
- (b) Hours of Operation. Commercial carwashes shall not be open to the public for operation prior to 7 a.m. and shall not operate after 8 p.m. everyday.

SECTION 5. Subsection 6402.I.8.(d) regarding Business Permits for Massage Parlors and Business of Massage of Chapter 4 of Article VI of the Lakewood Municipal Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

#### I. MASSAGE PARLORS AND BUSINESS OF MASSAGE.

**8.** Prohibitive Conduct. In addition to any other provision of this Code the following are applicable:

• • •

(d) No massage business permittee or other person shall permit any person under the age of eighteen (18) years to come or remain on the premises of any massage business establishment as a masseur or employee. In the instance where the client seeking treatment (e.g. sports injury) is under the age of eighteen (18) years, they shall be

> allowed on the premises only when accompanied by their parent or legal guardian, who shall remain on the premises and within sight of the underage client.

SECTION 6. Section 9364 regarding Location of Buildings in the M-1 zone of Part 6 of Chapter 3 of Article IX of the Lakewood Municipal Code is amended to have consistent wording between the M-1 and M-2 Zone Districts and remove outdated R-4 reference, to read as follows:

**9364. LOCATION OF BUILDINGS AND USES.** No area in Zone M-1 which is within fifty (50) feet of any property in a residential zone shall be used for M-1 uses. However, such area may be used for off-street parking for automobiles or access to M-1 property.

SECTION 7. Section 9365 regarding Front Yard of Part 6 of Chapter 3 of Article IX of the Lakewood Municipal Code is amended to clarify wording and remove an outdated reference to the R-4 zone, to read as follows:

**9365. FRONT YARD**. When property classified as M-1 comprises part of the frontage in a block otherwise zoned for residential purposes, the front yard in of such M-1 zoned property shall conform to the front yard requirements of the abutting residential zone.

SECTION 8. Section 9368.5 regarding Front Yard of Part 6a of Chapter 3 of Article IX of the Lakewood Municipal Code is amended to clarify wording and remove an outdated reference to the R-3 zone, to read as follows:

**9368.5**. **FRONT YARD**. When property classified as M-2 comprises part of the frontage in a block otherwise zoned for residential purposes, the front yard in of such M-1 zoned property shall conform to the front yard requirements of the abutting residential zone.

SECTION 9. CEQA. This Ordinance is exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to CEQA Guidelines Section 15061(b)(3) which is the general rule that CEQA applies only to projects which have the potential for causing a significant effect on the environment. CEQA does not apply where it can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the activity may have a significant effect on the environment. This Ordinance has no impact on the physical environment as it will only modify administrative procedures and not result in any changes to the physical environment.

SECTION 10. SEVERABILITY. If any section, subsection, subdivision, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this Ordinance, is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional by the decision of any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance. The City Council hereby declares that it would have adopted this Ordinance and each section, subsection, subdivision, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion thereof, irrespective of the fact that any one or more sections, subsections, subdivisions, sentences, clauses, phrases, or portions thereof be declared invalid or unconstitutional.

SECTION 11. CONTINUITY. To the extent the provisions of the Lakewood Municipal Code as amended by this Ordinance are substantially the same as the provisions of that Code as

they read immediately prior to the adoption of this Ordinance, then those provisions shall be construed as continuations of the earlier provisions and not as new enactments.

SECTION 12. CERTIFICATION. The City Clerk shall certify to the adoption of this Ordinance and shall post a certified copy of this Ordinance, including the vote for and against same, in the Office of the City Clerk, in accordance with Government Code Section 36933. The City Council hereby finds and determines there are no newspapers of general circulation both published and circulated within the City and, in compliance with Section 36933 of the Government Code, directs the City Clerk to cause the ordinance within 15 days after its passage to be posted in at least three (3) public places within the City as established by Ordinance.

SECTION 13. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Ordinance shall be posted or published as required by law and shall take effect thirty (30) days after its adoption.
