- **WHEREAS,** the month of May celebrates Asians and Pacific Islanders in the United States and is deserving of recognition and honor; and
- WHEREAS, Asian Americans and Pacific Islanders have played vital roles in shaping the nation from building the Transcontinental Railroad to advocating for labor law changes to fighting in multiple wars, making these contributions while also facing persistent discrimination and violence throughout United States history; and
- WHEREAS, with generations having enriched America's history, the diverse and growing population of Asian and Pacific Islander descendants make up more than 23 million people in the United States, and in less than 50 years nearly one of every ten people in America will trace his or her heritage to Asia and the Pacific--a region that covers more than one third of the earth; and
